## Agenda:

- **1.** Call to Order: Chair Blair-Fleetwood called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. with a quorum present.
- 2. Approval of the Minutes from the March 15, 2022 meeting: Gates moved to approve the minutes; Stenzel seconded the motion. The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
- 3. BFAAC Workplace Items/Updates:
  - Memo on Proposed Budget and CIP (or Capital Improvement Program):
     Chair Blair-Fleetwood opened the discussion on final comments on memo.
     Stenzel highlighted suggestions to the revenue, schools, communications and CIP memo sections. Secretary Rapanut moved to approve the BFAAC Memo on FY2023 Proposed Budget and CIP with necessary editorial changes and stated suggestions; Derrick seconded the motion. The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
  - Memo on State Revenues (assessing effects of state administration changes on city budget): Chair Blair-Fleetwood highlighted no significant changes in the state's top-level funds nor by funding topic after a review of the city's budget from FY2012 through FY2021. Graf moved to approve BFAAC Memo #8 City of Alexandria State Funding Assessment; Ruthinoski seconded the motion. The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
