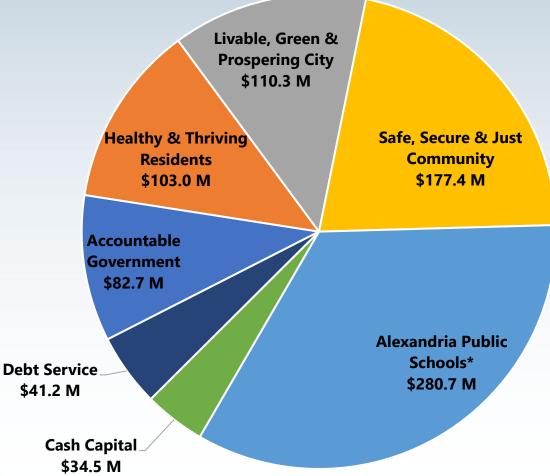
## **Budget Strategy**

FY 2023 General Fund Proposed Operating **Expenditures** 

\$829.9 Million



\$41.2 M



### **Budget Efficiency & Revenue Reductions**

- Departments received a 2.5% budget reduction target
- Efficiencies provided \$1.3M in citywide savings and eliminates 4.8 vacant positions
- \$1.5 million in revenue sources offsetting general fund expenses
- No reductions in City programs or services





# PRIORITY INVESTMENTS



### **4850 Mark Center Drive**

- DCHS & Health Support
- West End Service Center

### 4850 Mark Center Drive – DCHS & Health Support

- DCHS & Health Support: \$2,167,263 (GF) and \$400,000 (ARPA)
  - 5 Building operations and maintenance positions: \$439,539 (GF)
  - Building operations, maintenance, and security: \$1,577,724 (GF)
  - Shuttle Service: \$150,000 (GF)
  - Neighborhood Health Equipment and Furniture: \$400,000 (ARPA)

### 4850 Mark Center Drive - West End Service Center

- West End Service Center Resident Tax Services Support: \$161,550 (GF)
  - Two revenue/treasury positions to assist residents and taxpayers that access the West End Service Center 4850 Mark Center Drive with tax bills or in-person payments
  - Code-funded Permit Center positions
  - Limited Clerk of the Court functions

### **Organizational Infrastructure**

- Eviction Prevention Data Analytics: \$100,000 (ARPA Continuation of Tranche #1 Project)
  - OPA Performance Analyst position to continue providing assistance with eviction prevention data analytics, other ARPA analytics support, and other priority analytics support as needed
- Real Estate Acquisition Attorney: (CIP funded)
  - Support for real estate transactions for small- and large-scale projects across the City
- Budget Management Analyst position: \$100,000 (GF)
  - To address increased workloads related to collective bargaining, grant seeking, race and social equity, and civic engagement



### **Organizational Infrastructure - ITS**

- Hybrid Public Meetings: \$395,500 (ARPA)
  - Audio Video Technical Support Staff: \$220,000
  - Improved Virtual and Hybrid Public Meeting Spaces in City Hall: \$100,000
  - Virtual Meeting Licensing: \$60,000
  - Ongoing Annual Maintenance & Service for Council Chambers AV: \$15,500

### **Organizational Infrastructure - ITS**

- Contract Telecommunications Engineer, West End: \$137,959 (GF)
  - To support expansion of telecommunications systems at the new West End Service Center
- Cybersecurity Initiatives: \$108,000 (GF) and \$15,000 (ARPA)
  - Network Monitoring software
  - Cloud-based backup system that reduces the risk of disrupted City services
  - Consulting services to help provide subject matter expertise on network risk and vulnerabilities

## Climate Change – FY23 Budget

- DASH Electrification (CIP, \$105M)
- EV Navigator position
- EV Charging Infrastructure (CIP, \$9.5M)
- Heat Vulnerability Analysis
- Renewable Energy Credits
- 4850 Mark Center LEED initiatives

### **Community Engagement**

- City-Wide Community Outreach and Engagement: \$400,000 (GF)
  - Contingency funding for planning and implementation of City-wide community outreach, engagement, and communications strategies and initiatives

- RASE Program Manager: \$97,500 (GF)
  - Assist the City's Race and Social Equity Officer with managing and coordination of the City's race and social equity programs, projects, policy and initiatives

### **Human Resources**

- Position Management Platform: (no cost in FY 2023)
  Position management and compensation market data platform to support:
  - collective bargaining initiatives
  - employee pay competitiveness and equity
  - employee performance initiatives
  - talent attraction and retention
- Spring Health: Employee Assistance Program (EAP) that offers personalized mental healthcare with mental health resources, coaching, in-app wellness exercises, virtual therapy, and crisis support
