Statewide TICN Updates

- **Campaign for Trauma-Informed Policy and Practice**
 - WHO Report - ACEs cost U.S. \$748 billion a year in lost productivity
 - Encourage Congress to adopt trauma-informed legislation and fund local trauma-informed coalitions that can set their own priorities based on local needs
 - \$1.9 trillion stimulus bill has money that can be spent on trauma-informed efforts

Statewide TICN Updates

ACE Interface Training

- DBHS received some funding to create full-time role to lead the effort and part-time role to support
- DBDHS has allocated funds to address trauma and partner with TICNs with a focus on ACE Interface & Learning Communities
- ACE Interface is a storytelling that helps us to build empathy, understand ourselves and each other, help each other heal
- ACE Interface Master Trainers can train cohorts of presenters who can continue growing and giving this training
- Fairfax TICN put together a 3-day virtual train the trainer and is ready to do more of these cohort trainings
- **Next steps:** TICNs interested in having cohort training can reach out to Keith about the 3-day training; ideal cohort is 25-30 people

- **2021 General Assembly Session Results**

- See the outcomes of this year's session [on Voices for VA's Children site](#)
- Highlights include:
 - \$143,260 restored funding for ACEs Interface Training in FY22
 - A resolution declaring racism as a public health crisis in Virginia
 - \$517,553 allotted to support to the Virginia Helping Everyone Access Services (HEALS) program in FY22
 - State Health Commissioner will establish a Task Force on Maternal Health Data and Quality Measures to improve maternal care, quality, and outcomes.
 - \$2.4 million for increasing access to doula care for pregnant women in FY22
