Creation of Residential Permit Parking District 14 in Potomac Greens

Proposed District 14 Boundary

- 227 residential addresses
- Adjacent to the future east exit of the Potomac Yard **Metrorail Station**
- Privately operated HOA served by publicly owned streets
- 227 blank ballots mailed on March 2, 2022
- Ballot included a question on standard vs. custom parking restrictions



FIGURE 1: Proposed Potomac Greens Residential Permit Parking District Boundary

Results

- Responses taken by mail, email, and SurveyMonkey
- Response Rate: 227 blank ballots mailed, 155 unique completed ballots were returned
 - Response Rate: 68%
 - Code Requirement: 50%
- Of the 155 unique responses received, 147 support the creation of the proposed RPP District 14
 - District Creation Support Rate: 95%
 - Code Requirement: 60%

Parking Restrictions

- No action on Parking Restrictions/Signs at this meeting
- Ballot asked if residents supported "Standard Parking Restrictions" in the entire District
 - 2-Hour Parking, 8AM-11PM, Mon-Sat
- Of the 147 responses in support of creating the RPP District, 130 support establishing standard parking restrictions for the entire District
 - 57% of all residential addresses in the area
- Staff will evaluate these responses block by block to develop a proposal; Residents are free to use normal petition process.

Next Steps

- May-June: T&ES will analyze parking restriction responses to ensure each block exceeded 50%. Staff can also receive petitions to add signage to specific blocks in District 14
- June 27: Traffic & Parking Board considers proposed signage for District 14
- Fall 2022: Parking signs posted, enforcement begins
- September 10 October 22, 2022: WMATA closure, track tie-in
- October 2022: Potomac Yard Metrorail Station opens





- Further interdepartmental conversations with Planning & Zoning, Fire Department, and Public Works led to more substantial changes to the requirements
- City staff would like to make the requirements easier to understand as well as comply with





DASH FY23 TDP PROPOSALS

- ► TDP = Transit Development Plan
 - ► Annual process for DASH service/fare changes
 - ► Requires public outreach & board approval
- Proposed Changes on Lines 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 & 36
- Proposed Line 34 Changes (Effective Late 2022)
 - Re-route to new Potomac Yard Metro instead of Braddock Road Metro for better connectivity.
 - Re-align from N. Fairfax Street to N. Pitt Street from Cameron Street to 2nd Street to make more useful.



PROPOSED LINE 34 ROUTE CHANGE







PROPOSED LINE 34 ROUTE CHANGE

- Provides more useful bus service to dense residential and commercial areas on N. Pitt Street.
- Could mitigate existing traffic and parking issues on this corridor.
- Stop locations are TBD but staff is estimating 7-9 parking spaces would be removed over 9 blocks.
- Several stop bar relocations.

Council Direction

Mayor Wilson memo to Council, March 15:

- 1) Expansion of Residential Pay-By-Phone Area
 - Remove area limit on program, allow program to grow "organically"
- 2) Residential Pay-By-Phone Fees
 - Give staff authority to adjust rates in areas with parking scarcity
- 3) Incentivize City Garages
 - Reduce parking rates at garages with low utilization
- 4) Split RPP District 1
 - Act on OTAPS recommendation
