Summary of COVID-19 Guidance Changes/Updates for Schools & Daycares

June 24, 2022

Isolation & Quarantine

- Appendix C, D, G, and G.1 have been updated to reflect that close contacts who are not up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines are recommended to quarantine following an exposure.
- VDH and AHD recommend quarantine following an exposure to COVID-19 for those who a) have not tested positive for the virus in the past 6 months (changed from 90 days) or b) are not up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines.

Testing

- Appendix C, D, G, and G.1 have been updated to reflect that VDH now recommends
 that only close contacts who a) have not tested positive for the virus in the past 6
 months (changed from 90 days) or b) are not up to date on their COVID-19
 vaccines test on Day 5 following an exposure even if they do not have symptoms.
- Close contacts who develop symptoms should get tested immediately, regardless of vaccination status.

Masking

Appendix C, D, G, and G.1 have been updated to reflect that VDH now recommends
that only close contacts who a) have not tested positive for the virus in the past 6
months (changed from 90 days) or b) are not up to date on their COVID-19
vaccines mask following an exposure.

- Question 4 has been added to illustrate booster recommendation allowances for students 5-11yo.
- Question 16 has been updated to illustrate VDH/AHD quarantine guidance changes.

General

- Links in the *IX. Additional Resources* section have been updated and dates have been removed.
- Appendix A has been updated to encourage a variety of individual prevention strategies as needed following an exposure.
- Appendix B has been removed due to redundancies.
- VDH/AHD guidance may differ from CDC guarantine guidance.

June 13, 2022

Isolation & Quarantine

- Appendix J has been updated to reflect June and July 2022 dates. Interactive
 quarantine and isolation calculators are available through both <u>VDH</u> and <u>CDC</u>.
- Appendix D has been updated to reflect quarantine guidance in light of booster recommendations for younger students. Schools/daycares decide whether to require kids 5-11yo to be up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines to forgo quarantine after an exposure.
- Prioritization guidance has been added under *I. Implement Layered Prevention Measures (Part 8)*.

Outbreaks

- Appendix L has been added. This document is a template notification letter school/daycare administrators may use in response to outbreaks in school/daycare.
- The School Response Team phone line hours (for questions and to report outbreaks) have been adjusted to end at 4:30pm each business day.

Vaccination

• Appendix D has been updated to reflect booster recommendations for kids 5-11yo.

Testing

Physical Distancing

• Language regarding CDC recommendations for 6 ft distancing has been removed.

Ventilation

- CDC guidance regarding mealtimes has been removed (VII. Know how to make mealtimes as safe as possible).

March 4, 2022

Shortened Isolation & Quarantine Periods

- People who have COVID-19 (cases) should isolate for at least 5 days
 - Day 0 is the day their symptoms began or the day they got tested
 - Cases can return to school/daycare on Days 6-10 if they feel better, have been fever free for at least 24 hours, and are able to mask
- People exposed to COVID-19 (close contacts) should quarantine for at least 5 days
 - Day 0 is the date they were last exposed to COVID-19
 - People who are up-to-date on their COVID-19 vaccines do **not** need to quarantine, but they should wear a mask and monitor symptoms for 10 days.

Fully-Vaccinated vs. Up-to-Date

- Schools may choose whether they will require students ages 12-17 to be <u>up-to-date</u> or simply fully-vaccinated to forgo guarantine requirements.
 - AHD encourages everyone to stay up-to-date with their COVID-19 vaccines.

Reporting Requirements

- Schools & daycares are no longer required to report individual COVID-19 cases to AHD.
- Schools & daycares are required to report clusters of 3 or more COVID-19 cases to AHD using the <u>COVID-19 Outbreak Reporting Form</u>.

Masking Recommendations & Requirements

- Universal masking is recommended when COVID-19 Community Level is "High."
- <u>Senate Bill 739</u> states that the parents of children enrolled in public schools or any school-based early childhood care and education program may choose if their child wears a mask while on school property.
 - Private schools and daycares should ask their legal council if/how Senate Bill
 739 applies to their programs.
- The CDC no longer requires masking on school buses.
- Schools/daycares may require masks on Days 6-10 of isolation and guarantine.
- When masks cannot be worn (e.g., while eating or sleeping) physical distance should be maximized to the greatest extent possible. Inability to distance 6 ft during meals and naps should **not** preclude children from in-person instruction or childcare.

Case Investigation & Contact Tracing

- AHD encourages schools & daycares to continue to identify COVID-19 cases and notify close contacts of exposures for all community levels.
- The <u>close contact exemption of K-12 students</u> **does** *not* **apply** if students are unmasked.

COVID-19 Community Level

• Schools and Daycares should consider the current <u>COVID-19 Community Level</u> when adjusting layered prevention strategies.

Creative Solutions

- AHD recommends **best practices** for stopping the spread of COVID-19.
- AHD recognizes that different programs have varying levels of risk tolerance and encourages administrators to adopt creative solutions to meet their community's unique emotional, educational, and developmental needs.
