1. Public Comments:

David Peabody encouraged Hilco to commit to low energy usage intensity (EUI), high performance buildings and district energy for the PRGS site. Scott Barstow stated that PRGS target of 25% energy reduction was not enough to achieve City's 50% greenhouse gases reduction goal.

2. Meeting Minutes

Both February 28 and March 21 meeting minutes were approved by all members attended with one abstention and with Mike Bahleda's changes for the February 28 meeting minutes.

3. Committee Reports

Bill Pugh reported on the regional transportation planning board (TPB) transportation plan that is being open for public comment until May 1st. He also mentioned his involvement in the Eisenhower West/ Landmark Van Dorn infrastructure plan. Mike Bahleda mentioned the Hilco community meeting on March 31 that is focusing on transportation.

Edith Cecchini reported that a winner for the 2022 Ellen Pickering Award had been chosen and that the City would soon make an announcement.

Kathie mentioned the City budget final add/delete that would happen this Saturday and asked members for topics and priorities for FY23. She also mentioned the \$2 million that the City Manager is considering for climate change actions as part of FY23 budget. The Chair then asked for 5 projects totaling \$2 million as well as FY23 priorities list from each member for April 22 deadline.

4. Video re Net Zero Affordable Housing Projects in Philadelphia

The Chair Kathie Hoekstra showed a video titled "Affordable Housing – A Case for Passive House Design and Net Zero Energy" prepared by Timothy McDonald, as a preparation for the next agenda item, namely, the discussion on the Hilco PRGS redevelopment site sustainability strategies. The complete presentation supporting this video is on the EPC website.

5. Presentation on Redevelopment of the PRGS Site by the HRP Team

HRP presented the early Carbon Neutral Analysis (CNA) that showed targets of 25% reduction in operational carbon and 10% reduction in embodied carbon. Also, onsite PV can only generate \sim 3% of total site energy demand.

6. The HRP team mentioned that 1) Norfolk Southern corridor could only generate 3-4% onsite renewable; 2) PV efficiency improving over time; 3) Base energy load has limited options for control- 4) the CDD focuses on the site and infrastructure as a whole and not

building details but has built-in flexibility; 5) it is expected that the site will be 20-60% commercial and 40-80% residential; and 6) Initial estimate for site remediation was \$60 million based on the firm's experience with similar projects in the past. Several comments and concerns were expressed by the EPC members regarding the CNA and the Commission expressively requested that they have another opportunity to comment on this document and the Coordinated Sustainability Strategy (former known as the Sustainability Master Plan) and any other documents related to energy and the environment that have specific, measurable and time-bound details which the CNA and CDD do not before they go to the Planning Commission. The EPC then passed a motion to send a letter to the Planning Commission on the recommendations and comments on the CDD and the CNA prior to the PC's meeting on June 23rd.

7. The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 PM and the next meeting will be held on May 16.
