ASO Offering Free Gun Locks and Medication Lock Boxes

With assistance from the Department of Community and Human Services and Lock and Talk Virginia, the Sheriff's Office is now making gun locks and medication lock boxes available to Alexandrians at no cost. Medication lock boxes and firearm cable and trigger locks can be picked up at the ASO Visitor Center at the Alexandria Public Safety Center at 2003 Mill Road. September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month and these devices can reduce accidents and help prevent suicides by curtailing access to lethal means.



ASO Community Outreach Continues

Sheriff Sean Casey and ASO staff continue to enhance public safety and expand community outreach. Deputies helped hundreds of elementary students get safely to school and back home on their first day of school, and then on September 10, deputies joined Sheriff Casey at the teen block party organized by Alexandria Recreation, Parks and Cultural Activities (RPCA). Deputies and civilian staff also participated in First Thursday in Del Ray and most recently teamed up with Senior Services of Alexandria and RPCA at the Robust Walkathon at Ben Brenman Park to show seniors fun, easy and safe ways to keep active.




First Female Inmates Complete OSHA Construction Safety and Workplace Readiness Training

Five inmates recently completed professional development training that will help them when they return to the community and seek employment. These five are the <u>first women at the Adult Detention Center to complete the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 10-hour Construction Safety and Health curriculum and the 30-hour Workplace Readiness Skills training. Both are new educational programs the Sheriff's Office began offering through remote instruction during the past year.</u>
