TRANSIT AUTHORITY (WMATA) BUDGET

<u>ISSUE</u>: Consideration of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) FY24 Operating and Capital budgets.

**RECOMMENDATION**: That the Transportation Commission submit a letter to provide feedback on the FY24 budget.

**BACKGROUND**: On January 26th, the WMATA Board authorized Public Hearings on the Proposed FY2024 Operating and Capital Budget and FY2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program. The budget remained the same as the proposed budget with the addition of two potential options for reintroducing the 11Y service – during peak periods with 30-minute headways or 24-minute headways. The 11Y service would commence as soon as Yellow Line bridge reopens and the DC-3 shuttle service is terminated.

Public hearings will occur in early March 2023, with anticipated budget adoption in April 2023, and implementation by the start of FY 2024.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: FY 2024 Proposed Operating Budget includes revenue of \$509 million, expenses of \$2,322 million, total subsidy of \$1,252 million, and \$561 million of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) relief funding.

The FY 2024 operating budget gap of \$185 million will be closed by a combination of revenue increases, expense reductions and federal funding assistance, including both ARPA funding and increased Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Federal Formula Funding for Maintenance.

The proposed operating budget increases bus and rail service, simplifies fares, launches the Better Bus Network Redesign, funds crisis intervention specialists, and fully-funds Metro Transit Police Department (MTPD) positions.

Key rail service changes impacting Alexandria include Yellow Line trains every 6 min all day (An increase from 10 minutes budgeted in FY23 during peak periods and 12 minutes during off-peak,

with 15 minute actual frequencies as of August 2022 due to 7000 series train issues) and Yellow Line turning around at Mt Vernon Square. No bus services changes impacting Alexandria were proposed in the December 8, 2022 budget. The full bus network redesign is anticipated to be implemented in FY25.

Another major component of this budget is a simplification of the fare structure, including:

- Consolidated peak/off-peak fares
- Max fare increase to \$6.50; Reduced base fare of \$2 to match bus fare
- Introduction of a low income fare program administered by Metro

### **Staff Recommendation**

See Attachment 1 for a draft letter highlighting the following themes related to the Metro budget. The focus is on the operating budget given the number of new initiatives this year.

## FY 2024 Operating Budget

- Commend the inclusion of an 11Y service that best matches projected demand
- Open the Potomac Yard Metrorail Station for full revenue service
- Deliver budgeted rail and bus service levels to give riders a consistent and reliable alternative to driving
- Support the policy goals and concept of the proposed low-income fare program, with questions about implementation and funding

Re: WMATA FY24 Budget Comments

Dear WMATA Board of Directors:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed FY24 budget on behalf of the City of Alexandria's Transportation Commission. We applaud the proposed budget's delicate balance of cost saving proposals, fare simplification and equity proposals, and improved service. Moreover, we want to express our appreciation of the return of 11Y service to the City of Alexandria and County of Fairfax.

The DC-3 shuttle, which follows the 11Y route, has demonstrated demand, that we believe will continue even after the Yellow Line bridge reopens due to its direct, one seat ride and the push for a greater in person presence at the office. We further appreciate that there will be no break in service once the DC-3 shuttle goes away to keep it easy for riders. In terms of which service option – the 24 minute frequency, or the 30 minute frequency – the Transportation Commission believes that WMATA staff can determine which option to pursue to best serve demand.

We also support the new fare proposals in conjunction with the low-income fare pass. For the low-income fare pass, we hope that you continue to work with the jurisdictions and funding sources available to them, such as the TRIP program to ensure that the program is developed in the most efficient and effective way possible.

Lastly with regards to the FY24 budget, we greatly look forward to the opening of the Potomac Yard-VT Metrorail station in May and the subsequent increase in Yellow Line service – and overall service with the continued reintroduction of 7000 series vehicles.

Looking ahead, we recognize the dire situation that Metro is in for FY25 and beyond with the absence of Federal assistance and urge you to work closely with the jurisdictions to immediately begin looking at alternative funding options, to ensure that transit continues to serve the region's

MOBILITY UPDATE

**ISSUE:** Update on Capital Bikeshare and Dockless Mobility programs, including ridership trends, progress in Calendar Year 2022, and upcoming plans for Calendar Year 2023.

**RECOMMENDATION**: That the Transportation Commission receive this update.

**BACKGROUND**: The City joined the region's Capital Bikeshare system in 2011. In 2016, City Council approved a vision for bikeshare in the City as part of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Chapter update to the 2008 Transportation Master Plan adopted in 2016 and incorporated into the AMP in 2021. In FY 2021, dockless e-bikes were introduced into the system. These bikes do not have to be locked to a station and provide mobility options in areas with less dense station placement.

In November 2018, the City approved the creation of the Dockless Mobility Pilot program, which allowed private companies to deploy electric scooters and bikes for rent within the public right of way. In Summer and Fall 2019, Staff made changes to improve the program, including geofencing, installing parking corrals, and extensive public outreach. A permanent Dockless Mobility program was approved by the City Council in November 2021.

The Commission received an update on the Bikeshare program in January 2022. At that time, the Commission recommended focusing on state of good repair for the existing system and expanding to meet the obligations from new development. Staff is currently working with VDOT on the process for replacing 21 stations that are approaching the end of their useful life. Staff is also tracking the development contributions and determining a process for ordering and installing new stations when development is complete.

<u>**DISCUSSION:**</u> Staff is providing two micromobility updates to the Transportation Commission: (1) Capital Bikeshare updates and ridership trends; and (2) Dockless Mobility program updates and ridership trends.

## **Capital Bikeshare Updates**


Currently, there are 61 stations in the City, with the most recent installed at Mandeville Lane and Stovall Street in September 2022. The stations with the highest number of total trip origins and destinations were as follows:

- Main Line Blvd and E Glebe
- Prince St and Union St
- Braddock Rd Metro South
- Market Square
- King St Metro North

In the City, there were 5,735 trips per month on average in 2022 and 189 trips per day. July had the highest rider total with 9,122 trips and 294 per day on average. Across the regional Capital Bikeshare system, there were 14 reported crashes involving bikeshare riders. Only one of these crashes was in the City. The City's Capital Bikeshare webpage has a dashboard where the public can find additional information, such as ridership trends, individual station usage, and daily ride totals.

## **Upcoming Bikeshare Program Improvements**

The City is currently working to update all bike maps in bikeshare station kiosks. The maps will show bikeshare station locations, bike lanes and trails, significant uphill climbs, and notable destinations, such as libraries and farmer's markets. Installation is expected to be completed in the coming months.



The Cosmo, a new e-bike model by Lyft, is expected to launch this Spring.

Improvements include a larger battery, faster acceleration, and a redesigned front basket.



## Capital Costs


All capital costs are covered by VDOT grants and developer contributions. The City has received VDOT funding annually for several years and will have received approximately \$4.3 million in VDOT grants by FY 2026. Utilizing this funding, 17 new stations were installed in 2021 and 2022. Additionally, 21 existing stations that are approaching the end of their useful life will be replaced and 9 additional new stations will be installed in the next year. The City currently has approximately \$750,000 in developer contributions and expects 4-5 new developments to be ready for a new station over the next year. Below is a table showing approximate capital costs for new stations and bikes.

Station	\$30,000-\$50,000
Installation	Up to \$3,800
Classic bike	\$1,100
E-bike	\$4,000

### Operational Costs and Revenue

Annual operating costs for FY 2024 are projected to be \$1.3 million before cost recovery. Operations and maintenance costs are paid for through the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). City dollars for this program are offset by developer contributions, TDM contributions, and rider fees. Year-round cost recovery from usage and membership fees is approximately 20%.


## Capital Bikeshare Ridership Trends



## **Dockless Mobility Program Updates**

For the April 2022 – March 2023 permit year, four micromobility operators were originally permitted to deploy a collective total of 1,200 e-scooters and 200 e-bikes: Bird, Helbiz, Lime, and Superpedestrian. Veo was later permitted to deploy 300 additional e-bikes in October 2022.

The City tracks all devices deployed within City limits with Populus. In December, the City upgraded the functionality of this service to better enforce and inform operators of their compliance with City regulations, such as the distribution of devices in "equity zones," including Arlandria, west of I-395, and between Quaker Lane and I-395. Below is a table showing the required deployments for each zone and the change in operator compliance after enacting this change.



The 2023-2024 Dockless Mobility Permit Application was released on January 31, 2023. Current and interested companies have until February 21, 2023 to apply to operate dockless devices from April 1, 2023 – March 31, 2024. The scoring metric was adjusted from the previous permit application to increase the standards for approval and further emphasize past operator performance and compliance with City Code. Approved operators will be selected in March.

In February 2023, the City published a <u>public dashboard</u> and rider heatmap of the most popular routes. Additionally, it showcases trip data in the City from the current month, the previous month, and all time.




# <u>Upcoming Dockless Mobility Programs Improvements</u>


Beginning February 21, 2023, the City will be piloting a "slow zone" in Robinson Landing, a neighborhood with high pedestrian activity. E-scooter and e-bike top speeds will be limited to 8 miles per hour using their GPS location. If successful, the slow zone will be made permanent and may be expanded to other high pedestrian areas in the City.



The City is planning to install more dockless corrals, particularly in the West End. Operators are required to encourage riders to park devices in corrals to reduce the number of improper parking incidents. Additionally, GO Alex will hold at least 3 Learn to Ride events in 2023 to educate prospective riders on scooter etiquette and safe riding.

**ISSUE:** Staff update to Transportation Commission on various projects.

**RECOMMENDATION**: That the Commission receive the items for consent.

## A. I-495 Study Updates

The Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) has posted the Draft Summary Report for the I-495 Southside Capital Beltway Transit & TDM Study for public review and comment. This study includes draft recommendations for future transit service and TDM measures that may benefit this corridor. The study does not make recommendations regarding funding or operating these services. DRPT is accepting written comments on the study until 5:00 p.m. (EST) on Wednesday, February 22, 2023. Comments may be submitted via e-mail to drptpr@drpt.virginia.gov or in writing to Todd Horsley, Director of Northern Virginia Transit Programs, Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation, 1725 Duke Street, Suite 675, Alexandria, VA 22314.

This study complements the ongoing work of the VDOT I-495 Southside Express Lanes Study and is intended to identify a range of current and future multimodal solutions that can be implemented to reduce congestion, improve trip reliability and regional connections, and enhance existing and planned multimodal mobility and connectivity. In selecting the recommended potential improvements, the study examined the overall forecasted effect on reducing congestion, the benefits of proposed transit connections, and the projected cost of implementing the improvements. Public comments will be used to finalize the recommendations, which will inform potential future investments in transit in the I-495 Southside Capital Beltway corridor.

### B. Duke Street & Route 1 Intersection Safety Audits

In February 2022, the Transportation Commission endorsed an application to the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (MWCOG) Regional Roadway Safety Program (RRSP) to perform safety audits at the intersections of Duke Street & South Henry Street, and Duke Street & South Patrick Street. The RRSP provides short-term consultant assistance for planning and preliminary design projects that improve traffic safety. This project is included in the Fiscal Year 2023 Vision Zero Work Plan.

This project was awarded in summer 2022 and kicked off in the fall. The City is in the process of soliciting public feedback on safety challenges or concerns at these two intersections. An online feedback form is available on the <u>project webpage</u>, with comments being accepted through February 28. Staff will also be performing site visits this month to evaluate mobility, access, and safety features at each intersection.

Following the community engagement period and site audits, staff will work with the consulting firm to review the community comments and develop conceptual design options to improve safety. At the conclusion of the project (summer 2023), staff will recommend preferred design treatments for each intersection, which are expected to be implemented through a future project.

## C. Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Award

In June 2022, the Transportation Commission endorsed a grant application to the Safe Streets and Roads for All Program to perform safety audits and develop conceptual design alternatives at seven high-crash intersections around the City. Last month, the City was informed by the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) that the City's application was selected for award.

SS4A is a new program created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that funds projects that prevent roadway deaths and severe injuries. Staff will be working with USDOT in the coming months to execute the grant agreement, establish expectations for project administration, and begin the project. Staff will provide updates at key milestones to the Transportation Commission as appropriate.

### D. King Street/Commonwealth Ave Railroad Bridge Update

After public engagement over the fall, the Virginia Passenger Rail Authority (VPRA) has completed the final King Street and Commonwealth Avenue Bridges Feasibility Study. The final recommendation is to remove and replace the existing structures with new ballasted deck bridges. VPRA has indicated that this option will likely allow them to widen the span of the bridges to provide additional space for other modes below. VPRA will proceed with the design for this option this spring.

### E. Long-Range Planning Interdepartmental Work Program

Each year, City departments involved in long-range planning and implementation jointly prepare a Long-Range Planning Interdepartmental Work Program for the upcoming fiscal year and beyond. The work program includes the completion of plans and studies underway, new plans scheduled to begin, and implementation of previously approved plans.

The draft work program is presented for Planning Commission and City Council feedback and guidance early each calendar year to help inform development of the City Manager's Proposed Operating Budget as well as development of a final Work Program docketed for City Council approval in May. This annual review ensures coordination of work, staffing and financial resources, and the opportunity for Planning Commission and City Council to ensure alignment of proposed planning work across departments with the City's Strategic Plan. City Council provided feedback on the the Work Program Bar Chart in Attachment 1 at their meeting on January 24, 2023. Staff will incorporate guidance provided by Planning Commission and City Council at their January 2023 meetings, as well as coordinate among departments to further refine project scopes and timing. Feedback on the draft work program will inform the FY 2024 budget process, as well as the final work program to be considered for approval by City Council in May 2023.

## F. Transportation Commission 2023 Workplan

At the December 2022 and January 2023 meetings, Commissioners provided input on the draft 2023 Transportation Commission workplan, a working document that helps set the agenda for Commission meetings throughout the year.
