



Facilities Management


- The Department manages & operates

- In FY 2015, General Services began utilizing technical experts to assess facilities and their components.
- This assessment provides a framework for long term planning, decision making and budgeting for capital replacement based on each facility's Facility Condition Index (FCI) or Grade.

DCHS/Health Department Consolidation:

 Staff coordinated the lease and purchase options for the office building at 4850 Mark Center Drive from the Institute for Defense Analyses (IDA) on behalf of the City for the consolidation of DCHS and Health Department operations.





Real Estate

DCHS/Health Department Consolidation:

- On December 14, 2021, City Council unanimously voted to name the new building at 4850 Mark Center Drive the Redella S. "Del" Pepper Community Resource Center based on the results of a community survey.
- Beginning in February 2023, more than 700 City employees started moving from their existing leased and City-owned facilities to the Redella S. "Del" Pepper Community Resource Center.
- The building will house the Department of Community and Human Services (DCHS), Alexandria Department of Health (AHD), Neighborhood Health Clinic, Permit Center, the Finance Department, and limited Clerk of Court services.

DCHS/Health Department Consolidation:

- Renovations at 4850 Mark Center Drive began in FY 2023 in preparation of the consolidation and relocation of the Department of Community & Health Services, Neighborhood Health and the Virginia Department of Health.
- The facility was renovated utilizing principles in accordance with the City's Green Building Policy and the Environmental Action Plan.








- Phase I of interior renovations which includes office space for the NVUL was completed in Summer 2021.
- Phase II will begin in FY 2024 and will include replacement of the windows, roof and siding.
- Phase III will include additional restoration based on the results of a pending Historic Structures Report




Major Capital Improvement Projects

New Burn Building - FY 2024

- The Fire Department's new Burn Building is currently in the design process with construction expected to start in FY 2024.
- The Burn Building will provide additional training opportunities outside of basic fire scenarios for the City of Alexandria's first responders.
- The existing Burn Building has exceeded its useful life expectancy of 30 years.






