

Executive Summary

- ► Tall Ship Providence Foundation (TSPF) is a 501(c)(3) educational non-profit
- Serve as a floating classroom to educate guests on the role Providence and the Continental Navy played in the American Revolution
- Acquired Providence in 2017 & conducted 30-month "keel to masthead" restoration
- Business model is to be a profitable, self-sustaining non-profit organization, modeled after a successful for-profit business operated by Historic Tours of America
- ► In 2020, Senator John Warner signed on to lend his name to new Maritime Heritage Center
- Advisory Committee of eight former Secretaries of the Navy
- Started construction on the Maritime Heritage Center in November 2022

Why a Tall Ship?





- Signature attraction Alexandria is known as a "Port City" but there is no ship
- Create educational opportunities learn about colonial maritime history and experience life aboard an 18th century sailing ship
- Host learning programs through partnerships with the Alexandria Seaport Foundation and others
- Contribute to local economy serve as a proven draw for the region and around the world
- Serve as a catalyst for future investment in our maritime history

Why Providence?

Historically Significant

- First ship authorized by the Continental Congress
- First American command of John Paul Jones
- Captured more than 40 prizes
- First ship to bring American Marines to foreign soil

Attractive Financials

- Fiberglass hull reduces maintenance costs
- Low break-even costs with multiple revenue streams
- U.S. naval history creates links to other organizations and will help with fundraising efforts

"Small" Tall Ship

- Big enough to create dynamic visitor experience and be a key attraction
- Small enough to navigate the Potomac River (9' draft)
- Lower operating expenses than larger ships
- > 102' length overall, 65' on deck


- One of the top visitor attractions in Boston

- For-profit enterprise with \$8M+ revenues











Timeframe & Grand Opening

- High Level Schedule
 - April
 - Demolition of old pilings, drive piles for timber landing & connect brackets for utilities
 - Haul out, maintenance, paint
 - Float dock down from Baltimore , gangway & land utilities
 - May
 - Annual USCG inspection
 - Bring utilities to the Center
 - A-V installation, code inspections, rehearsal, photographs & move in
 - June
 - Rehearsals continue & punch list continue
 - Open for tours for Alexandria's Portside Festival 6/17
