Five Deputies Recognized at Public Safety Valor Awards

The Alexandria Chamber of Commerce recently honored several public safety professionals, including five members of the Sheriff's Office, for their bravery and life-saving actions. Captain Dave Cutting, Sergeant Victor Ignacio, Sergeant Brian Wade, Master Deputy Hafsa Munir and Deputy Joseph Walker were recognized by the Chamber of Commerce at the annual [Public Safety Valor Awards](#) on June 1. Sheriff Sean Casey congratulated each of the deputies as they received life-saving awards for successful interventions with individuals who were in crisis and in danger of self-harm. Fifteen Deputies Graduate from Criminal Justice Academy

Fifteen deputy sheriffs [graduated from the Northern Virginia Criminal Justice Training Academy](#) on June 16. Sheriff Casey and members of his command and training staff attended Session 148's graduation ceremony in Leesburg. The graduates successfully completed 20 weeks of training in emergency vehicle operations, firearms, defensive and control tactics, crash investigation, de-escalation techniques, basic legal training, jail operations, courthouse security and civil process. [Deputy Derek Mainville received the Director's Award for Academic Excellence](#) for earning the highest overall score in the combined law enforcement and deputy school.
