ALEXANDRIA SPOTLIGHT

This month we are celebrating the work of Lisette Torres! Lisette has been the Coordinator of the Alexandria Campaign on Adolescent Pregnancy (ACAP) for 11 years. During that time, Lisette has...

- Engaged and organized a coalition around reducing unintended pregnancy and ensuring that youth have accurate sexual health information and access to sexual and reproductive health care services.
- Grown the ACAP's membership, developed strong relationships across the city and region, and is respected by everyone who works with her.
- Facilitated countless meetings where all voices were heard and included, where ideas and questions were captured, and where people came together to guide the direction of the organization.
- Treated everyone with respect and kindness.
- Served as a mentor through the SOHO program.
- Launched the successful PREP grant and supervised its implementation for 11 years.
- Collaborated with her colleagues to:
 - develop and host the annual Alexandria Youth Leadership Conference,
 - host "Youth Speak Up" events, "Health Conversations," and quarterly "Titan Takeover" teen nights at recreation centers across the city to provide youth with a fun, substance-free place to hang out on a Friday night,
 - bring the Developmental Assets framework to Alexandria, sparking a movement that inspires every adult to support young people through intentional relationship building, safe and nurturing environments, and creating and connecting youth to opportunities.
- launch the Keep It 360 Peer Advocate program which hires and trains youth to educate their peers on making healthy life choices.
 Supported and empowered youth to express their ideas and serve in leadership positions.







- Embodied the spirit of what it means to be a public servant.
- Received awards and accolades, including:
 - the Vola Lawson Award in recognition of her significant contributions to the well-being and elevation of the status of women in the City of Alexandria and
 - Alexandria's 40 Under 40 for her exemplary work in Alexandria.
- Provided her strong leadership to support various initiatives across Alexandria focused on prevention and promoting positive youth development.
- Graduated from the City Manager's inaugural RISE Leadership Academy.

What is something that Lisette taught you?

It's ok to spend a little money to make an event or program nice. This has an impact on how people feel when they are attending. Creating a nice space for attendees is important.

Lisette taught me to always center youth voice, from beginning to end, when working on youth issues. She also taught me HOW to center youth voice to honor and protect them as they share their views and experiences.

Being able to secure the HHS PREP Grant to ensure the City of Alexandria had the resources to decrease the teen pregnancy rate and better educate youth about ways to protect themselves from STI's. The City has been a recipient of the PREP grant for over 10 years and Lisette is a BIG reason for this.



Her commitment to the PREPprograms and CYEP enabled us to do our jobs easily and left countless Alexandria youth feeling heard, seen, and knowing they have adutts in the community who genuinely care about them.

BY BRINGING THE DEVELOPMENTAL ASSETS FRAMEWORK TO ALEXANDRIA, SHE HELPED BUILD A MOVEMENT IN OUR CITY WHERE PEOPLE ARE MORE INTENTIONAL ABOUT THEIR INTERACTIONS WITH YOUTH. 
WHY THIS MATTERS

When young people have access to comprehensive, medically accurate and inclusive sexual health information delivered by educators they trust, they are empowered to plan for the futures they desire.


Sex Ed For All Month is an opportunity to raise awareness and call for real investment in sex education in schools and communities across the United States. Young people benefit from sex ed because it:

- Gives them age-appropriate, medically accurate information so they can have healthy relationships, make healthy decisions, and have positive health outcomes.
- Teaches them the importance of treating everyone with dignity and respect, with racial justice, fairness, and compassion for others as core values.
- Strengthens a family's bonds and understanding of their values and helps to create more open and honest communication.


Sex education can occur at all grade levels with information that is age- and culturallyappropriate.



- In elementary school, sex ed covers foundational building blocks around things like consent and boundary setting with friends, understanding our bodies, and the beautiful diversity in the ways people form and have families.
- In middle school, sex ed addresses relevant issues such as puberty, healthy peer relationships and anti-bullying, and media literacy skills to support kids in developing a healthy body image.
- In high school, sex ed covers everything from birth control and safer sex, to sexual decisionmaking and communication skills, to understanding how society and culture shape our ideas about sex, gender, and race, and how we can work towards more equitable communities.






Implementing ACAP's Latino Outreach Plan to provide prevention messaging and information to Latino community

of participants are likely to resist or say no to someone if they are pressured to participate in acts, such as kissing, touching private parts, or sex




