### **OSTP School Year Update:**

Currently, the OSTP has 1,495 children enrolled citywide, including Nannie J. Lee's Youth Achieving Greatness, Therapeutic Recreation, and LINK Club participants.

#### Program Wrap-ups:

 On September 25, Patrick Henry Recreation Center held a Teen Pop-Up Event. Teens in the Link Club at the Francis C Hammond Middle School Campus engaged in a relaystyle soccer game and a basketball shoot out.



• On September 27, Patrick Henry's **Anime Society Club** had the chance to hone their anime fight choreography skills by practicing on break boards.





• On September 30, the Youth Activities Section co-hosted its **Annual Kiwanis Kids Fishing Day at Lake Cook.** It was a beautiful sunny day with a perfect breeze and subtle cloud coverage. Over 25 youth ages 8 to 12 years old, joined 20 Key Club volunteers, 6 Kiwanis Club members and 10 RPCA OSTP staff for a day of fishing, fun and creating amazing memories. The group enjoyed learning how to bait and cast their fishing line as well as learning about what types of fish live in Lake Cook. Over 15 fish were caught and released, someone even caught a hefty catfish.





On October 3, Patrick Henry staff members, Rodney Bates, and Beverly Black, collaborated with the Successful Aging Committee on the Robust Walkathon for Seniors. The event was held at Ben Brenman Park and participants used exercise stations to learn a variety of ways to exercise and stay in shape. There was special participation from public safety representatives of the Alexandria Fire and Sheriff's Department.





 On Wednesday October 11, Mount Vernon Recreation Center hosted a Kid Rock Social Hour Pop-Up. Youth ages 0-4. The families had the opportunity to play in the playroom and have story and music time with Ms. Katie and Vanatta from Duncan Library. We had over 80 participants.



#### **Program Updates:**

- The Alexandria City Employee Cup Series (City Cup) kickball season has started at Four Mile Run Softball Field. The Alexandria City Employees Cup Series was developed to improve City employees' well-being by making healthy choices and living an active lifestyle while competing against each other in a friendly/fun filled atmosphere. Each agency would be offered the opportunity to compete in three different coed leagues (kickball, basketball & softball). The agency that has the highest total of points at the end of the season will be declared City Cup Champions and will be able to display the award for a period of one year. This season, teams from RPCA, City Hall, Police, DASH and DCHS have started the series.
- our summer break! The play area, intended for kids from 9 months to 4 years, is open from 9:30am-12:30pm Monday through Friday. Recently we partnered with the Buddie Ford Nature Center to have a free meet and greet with one of our animal friends! We hope to do more of these free activities throughout the year for our little friends.



• The **SPLASH program** at Chinquapin Recreation Center and Aquatics Facility has returned. The program introduces 4<sup>th</sup> grade students to the water and teaches them water safety and basic swimming skills. It's currently on track to host all 15 elementary schools this year and reach over 50 children a day.



• In September, Chinquapin aquatic programs kicked off **bi-lingual swim lessons**. Community members can participate in Spanish swim lessons for children 6mo -17yrs. Bi-lingual lessons are offered Sunday mornings, 9am - 12pm. Enrollment is continuous as this program grows.

#### **Upcoming Events:**

- On October 26, Mount Vernon Recreation Center will host **Lights-On After School** in conjunction with After School Alliance. This event calls attention to the importance of afterschool programs for America's children, families, and communities.
- On October 27, the Mount Vernon Recreation Center will host their **Annual Family Masquerade Ball**. Families will enjoy an evening of dancing, food, and haunted games.

- On October 27, the Nature Center will participate in William Ramsay's annual **Trunk or Treat event**. Nature Center staff will provide take-home craft kits and candy.
- On October 27, Chinquapin Aquatic Center will host the **Floating Pumpkin Patch** from 5-7pm.
- On October 27, Patrick Henry Recreation Center will host the annual **Family October Fest**. Participants will enjoy a fun filled evening of arts & crafts, musical chairs, moon bounce, a costume parade, carnival games fun spooky dancing and more family fun activities.
- On October 30, the Nature Center will host "Art and Nature" camp. Participants will learn about and work with a variety of mediums that come from the Earth. Registration is closed as this program is full!
- October 30 is an ACPS Teacher Workday. RPCA will host several Teacher Work-Day Camps. Kids ages 5-14 can enjoy programs ranging from Basketball, to Cooking, to Gymnastics! Registration is open now.

#### **Special Features:**

• Chinquapin Recreation Center & Aquatic Facility is in the middle of much-needed **updates and repairs** to the diving boards. One of the boards is having the rails repaired and replacing the stand and fulcrum. After consideration of resources and utilization of space at the pool, the decision was made to remove the second diving board. This will allow for much-needed deck space. We expect to have the project completed in early November.



• Chinquapin Recreation Center & Aquatic Facility has sold out of **parking passes** for the students of ACHS (seniors) to park on the loop. 184 parking permits were issued.

#### 3. NATURAL LANDS MANAGEMENT

- a. Invasive Plant Management and Ecological Restoration
  - Staff removed Porcelain-berry, Oriental Bittersweet, Privet, Rose of Sharon, and other non-native invasive plants from Dora Kelley Nature Park, Fort Williams Park, Fort Ward Park, Chinquapin Park, Forest Park, Timberbranch Parkway, and Monticello Park.
  - Staff supervised our contractor, Invasive Plant Control (IPC), in treating Kudzu, Porcelain-berry, Callery Pear, Siberian Elm, English Ivy, and other non-native invasive plants along the Holmes Run Trail and pedestrian path along Eisenhower

Avenue and at the Vola Lawson Animal Shelter, Fort Ward Park, Cora Kelly School, Hillside Park, and Beach Park.

• Staff sowed 2 lbs. of locally collected site-appropriate native wildflowers, grasses, and sedges in the Fort Ward Park Meadow

#### b. Cooperative Initiatives

- On September 14, 2023, City Natural Resource Manager gave a PowerPoint presentation "Virginia Goldenrods Examined" to the Virginia Native Plant Society Potowmack Chapter. One hundred-fifty participants registered.
- On September 21, 2023, the City Natural Resource Manager gave a PowerPoint presentation "Preserving Oak Diversity of Virginia's Tidewater Region" to the Virginia Native Plant Society John Clayton Chapter.
- On October 8, 2023, the City Natural Resource Manager led two field trips to Chinquapin Park and Forest Park for the Arlington Regional Master Naturalists Fall Chapter meeting at Chinquapin Park.
- On October 15, 2023, City Natural Resource Manager supervised an ecological restoration workday at Monticello Park with at least 40 volunteers with the Audubon Society of Northern Virginia, Arlington Regional Master Naturalists, North Ridge Civic Association, Friends of Monticello Park, and Boy Scouts Troop 129. Two-and-a-half tons of bank run gravel and mulch were spread along trails. Three site-appropriate native trees and six Spicebush shrubs were planted. Three giant, invasive Bush Honeysuckle shrubs were cut and treated, and thousands of ripe berries were painstakingly removed and bagged by volunteers.
- On October 15, 2023, Alexandria Tree Steward Bonnie Petry and community volunteers, under the supervision of Natural Lands Management, worked with 27 volunteers with the veteran's service group "The Mission Continues" on an ecological restoration planting of site-appropriate native canopy trees at the Vola Lawson Animal Shelter and vicinity.
