## Auditions Sunday, March 17, 2024, 2:00—5:00p.m.

Each applicant will have up to 2 minutes to give a small presentation about a historical topic of his or her choosing. Creativity is welcome, especially using objects to tell the story, but remember, there won't be much time to set up. (Tip: focus on a short story you could tell with an object or picture.) Museum staff will be looking for presentation skills (Did they come prepared? Could we hear them? Were they enthusiastic?) and will ask a few simple questions after the presentation. Presenting without reading notes is strongly encouraged.

#### **Training and Study Commitment**

In addition to attending one of the dates from training Session A and B, students are encouraged to attend one or both of the special trainings focused on activity stations (historic chocolate making station on **Saturday**, **June 1** and/or 18th-century clothing & society station on **Sunday**, **June 2. Both 9:30-11 a.m.**).

Participants will be required to complete readings and prep work as well as follow one museum.



#### What do Junior Docents do?

Junior Docents are primarily trained to give stationed tours of the museum on Sundays during the summer. Those who attend the additional activity station trainings can assist with hands-on demonstrations as well. Once accepted, Junior Docents can continue to volunteer at the museum without reapplying each year. Occasional school-year opportunities available.

### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

- 1. What are the duties of Jr. Docents? Jr. Docents learn how to share the history of the taverns with guests through "stationed tours," practicing public speaking skills and building confidence while spread throughout different rooms of the museum.
- 2. **Will museum staff always be present for events?** Yes, a staff member is always walking through the rooms to check on students and provide feedback in addition to teen peer mentors.
- 3. **Is there a fee for my child to participate in the program?** No. We also provide a free shirt to wear during shifts.
- 4. **Does a parent/guardian need to stay at the museum during shifts?** An adult is required to check-in with staff at drop-off and pick-up, but is not required to stay for the entire shift. Note, families can visit for free to see their student in action!
