Central Services Prior Year Investments - FY2022-24

- Network Cybersecurity Monitoring
- Additional staffing for Race & Social Equity Office
- Additional staffing to support Del Pepper Center
- Disparity Study funding
- Citywide mailings prior to state general elections



Central Services – FY 2025

- Election Support: \$199,900 (p. 11.101)
- Facilities Staffing: \$128,000 (p.11.40)
- Cybersecurity: \$330,000 (p. 11.63)
- Business Registration Pilot Program: (Net \$130,000 in revenue) (p.11.28)



Central Services - FY 2025

- Debt Manager: \$150,000 (p.11.28)
- Personal Property Tax Penalty: \$215,000
 Revenue (p.11.27)
- Additional penny: Cyclical compensation review funding: \$1M (Slide 25 – proposed budget presentation)

Communications and Cultural Affairs Prior Year Investments – FY 2022-24

- City-Wide Community Outreach and Engagement

Communications and Cultural Affairs – FY 2025

- OHA Community Remembrance: \$72,031(p. 13.32)
- OHA Special Events Rental Fees: \$20,000 Revenues (p. 7.3)
- Mobile Hotspots and Chromebooks: \$30,222 (p.12.43)



Economic Strength Prior Year Investments – FY 2022-24

Economic Strength – FY 2025

- Minnie Howard Aquatics Center: \$267,743 (p. 12.59)
- Tons of Trucks: \$15,000 (p.12.60)
- Signature Events Support: \$34,000 (p.12.60)
- Arts Grants: \$71,000 (p.12.60)
