DO I QUALIFY FOR ASSISTANCE?

Households must meet income requirements to qualify for certain City housing programs. Income limits vary by program and household size and are based on regional median incomes calculated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Home Rehabilitation Loan Program (HRLP)

Provides no-interest, deferred payment loans up to \$135,000 (up to \$75,000 for condominiums) to address code violations, structural problems, lead remediation, energy efficiency improvements, and other safety and accessibility modifications.
