VOLUNTEERS



At RPCA, our vision is to enhance the well-being of every individual in our community by fostering meaningful connections—both with one another and the environment. This year, volunteerism played a vital role in achieving this vision, bringing together over 4,800 people through social and environmental engagement across the City of Alexandria. This incredible effort included community groups, local businesses, and several students from local high schools.

The latest figure from Independent Sector, with the Do Good Institute, announced on April 23, 2024, that the latest value of a volunteer hour is estimated to be \$33.49 in 2023, a 5.3% increase from 2022.
