

DOT Paratransit

- Provides ADA required transportation for people with disabilities around the region for residents
- Contractor operated
- Vendor will "lease" city owned vehicles
- Benefits:
 - Reduced program cost to taxpayer
 - Improved user experience with new and smaller vehicles
 - Improved vehicle and wheelchair lift reliability

Background



Therapeutic Recreation and DCHS

- Therapeutic Recreation provides recreation programing for residents of all ages with disabilities
- DCHS provides transportation to city residents through social service type city programs
- Vehicles will not require a CDL and replace non-accessible vehicles used for programs for people with disabilities
- Benefits:
 - Provide wheelchair accessible vehicles to the Adaptive Recreation program that can be driven by current staff.
 - Expand the accessible fleet in the city to serve all residents






Transportation Alternatives Grant Information

- > Every two years

Additional Information:

- > Maximum \$2.5M grant award per project
- > 20% local match required
- > Applications due August 15, 2025
- > Award announcements expected in 2026



(e.g. construction projects that improve safety)


Additional Information:

- Applications due June
 26, 2025
- Award announcements expected by late 2025



Project Application: Updated Vision Zero Action Plan

- Vision Zero goal
 - Eliminate fatal and severe crashes by 2028
- Chart a path for traffic safety beyond
 2028 goal year
- Supports Alexandria Mobility Plan goals to improve traffic safety





Cost	Funding Request
Total Project Cost	Up to \$750,000
Federal Request	Up to \$600,000
Local Match	Up to \$150,000
