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Staff Reports

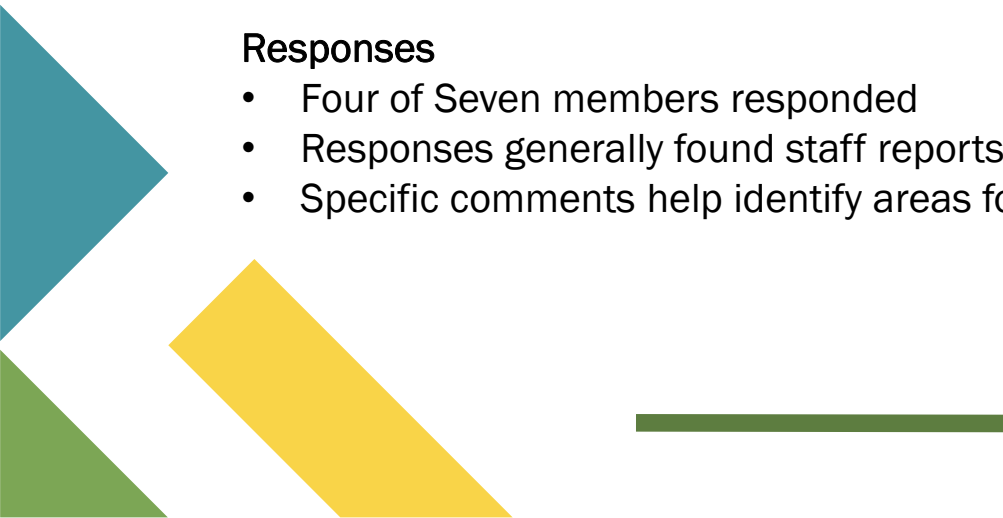
- An important tool in the development review process

- Specific comments help identify areas for improvement



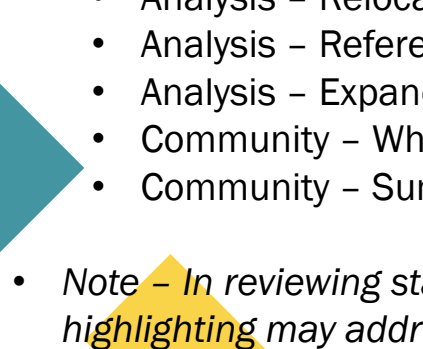

Survey Results

- 5 topics had three or more positive responses
 - 4 topics had two or more negative responses; they were:
 - Background,
 - Breadth of Analysis,
 - Depth of Analysis,
 - Staff Recommendation.
 - **Suggested improvements to improve the above areas include:**
 - Review Standards – Clearly reference/cite standards for review at the beginning of the report/application summary
 - Analysis – Relocate Zoning analysis under the analysis heading
 - Analysis – Reference/cite the applicable standards and clearly state how the proposal compares
 - Analysis – Expand analysis to include sewer, tree canopy coverage, and fiscal impacts
 - Community – When summarizing advisory group feedback, provide a consistent level of detail
 - Community – Summarize how the application changed in response to community feedback
 - *Note – In reviewing staff reports, the above materials are generally included, so formatting and/or highlighting may address several areas*
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
