
SIGNIFICANCE

Another show of the significance of this issue is the amount of worrying parents do. Events of today make this worry for kids to be unsafe at school very realistic and can lead some parents to even not want to send their kids to school, leading to their future being possibly affected.

HOW ARE WE DOING?

The situation in Alexandria in regards to school safety is currently not improving, in fact, it's recently been getting worse as time progresses. With the data obtained from an ACPS school board report, it can be shown the number of times a "call for service" for an SRO has occurred at their largest schools. The data shows a trend for the two high school campuses being relatively mellow when it comes to needing calls for service, but the middle schools require more attention. One possible outlook this data can provide is the increased importance of security that the high schools have placed on them, which causes fewer incidents to slip through the cracks, but the middle schools don't get such treatment. Even when looking at the average calls for service for these schools across these three months, the number of them ends up increasing in the end, supporting the stance that major strides in improving school security have not been taken.

- School issued physical ID's to be reinstated and all cell phones are to be out of sight and taken for the class period to keep students off their phones.
