Time & Place 250








- Commemorate the nation's 250th birthday
- Focus on the Declaration of Independence
- Location: Courthouse courtyard
- Dates: April November 2026
- Budget: \$35,000

City Hall & Market Square



- Interior & Exterior public art installations
- Foster a welcoming and inclusive civic space
- Honor Alexandria's rich and layered past while celebrating its future.
- Respond meaningfully to the physical and environmental context of City Hall and Market Square.
- Amplify Alexandria's reputation as a vibrant arts destination.
- Budget: \$300,000 (~60% developer contributions)

North Potomac Yard Park






- One or more pieces
- Dramatic, visually compelling, and unique work(s) of art
- Create an interactive environment for people of all ages that encourages continued use, gathering, and community participation at the park
- Nationwide call 150 applications
- Budget: \$300,000 (100% developer contributions)

Powhatan Park




- In coordination with the overall park improvements

Annual Workplan




The Workplan


- Takes a multi-year view,
- outlines which new projects the program will initiate
- identify where the projects are located
- Propose project budgets



- 5 artists
- 18 shelters/stations
- Add character and identity to the individual stations
- Add delight to the user experience of the stations, while adding value to passersby and travelers on the corridor that would view the artwork from a distance
- Budget: \$25,000 per station (~50% developer contributions)
