Meeting One: Visioning Activity Themes and Results

Summary of the **main themes** that emerged around the vision for a healthier, more equitable, and vibrant future in the Landmark/Van Dorn area.

1. Health and Healthcare Access

- **Affordable, equitable healthcare** for all, including preventive, dental, and mental health services.
- **Culturally competent care** and **trust in providers**, especially for women and multicultural populations.
- Substance-free spaces and support for addiction recovery.
- **Full-body diagnostics**, clean air and water, and reduced exposure to harmful substances.

2. Mental Health and Wellbeing

- Mental wellness promotion, including mindfulness and reducing stigma.
- Safe spaces for LGBTQ+ youth and others needing emotional support.
- Emphasis on **hope**, **dignity**, **and respect** across all ages and backgrounds.

3. Walkability, Transportation, and Infrastructure

- **Walkable neighborhoods** with smooth sidewalks, safe crossings, and traffic calming (e.g., speed bumps).
- Reliable, clean public transit, including free buses and east-west connectivity.
- **People-focused infrastructure** that prioritizes pedestrians over cars.

4. Green and Clean Environments

- More green spaces, parks, trees, and community gardens.
- Clean air and water, noise reduction, and litter-free public areas.
- **Environmental health** through mosquito control, clean bus stops, and pollution reduction.

5. Housing and Economic Justice

- Affordable, safe housing for families, seniors, and diverse income levels.
- **Tenant rights and voice amplification**, addressing power imbalances with landlords.
- Better-paying jobs not tied to federal employment and economic justice for all.

6. Education and Youth Support

- **Fully staffed schools**, free preschool, and after-school care.
- **Youth empowerment** through caring adults, social engagement, and strengths-based education.
- Affordable summer camps and spaces for teens to gather safely.

7. Food Access and Nutrition

- Affordable, healthy, and local food through farmers markets, city-sponsored grocers, and walkable grocery access.
- **Nutrition education** and food free of chemicals and additives.

8. Community Connection and Belonging

- **Cultural festivals**, block parties, and communal celebrations.
- **Community centers** and events that foster interaction and inclusion.
- **Neighbors supporting each other**, with a shared sense of respect and belonging.

9. Safety and Cleanliness

- Safe neighborhoods free from violence, drugs, and environmental hazards.
- Clean public spaces, including dog waste management and trash removal.

10. Innovation and Technology

 Use of **technology** to support health, community engagement, and access to services.
