My name is Mack Wyche, and I am Allan Tucker's bonus dad.

I am usually a man of few words, but today I need to speak from the heart about the injustice my son faced on his final day.

Allan was not perfect none of us are, but he had one of the biggest hearts of anyone I have ever known. When he saw someone struggling, he did whatever he could to help. He believed in looking out for people and gave generously money, his time, kindness, and love. He often talked about wanting to do better, build a better future, and be there for the people he cared about.

That is Allan, I knew. That is Allan, our family loved.

What breaks my heart is knowing that in his final hours, when he needed compassion the most, he was met with indifference. He repeatedly asked for medical help. He pleaded to go to the hospital. Those cries for help should have been heard. They should have been answered. Instead, they were ignored.

No family should ever have to read an official report confirming that their loved one begged for medical care while in police custody and was denied that basic human dignity. No parent should have to wonder if their child would still be alive today had someone simply listened.

As his bonus dad, I carry the pain of knowing Allan died feeling helpless, knowing that the people entrusted with protecting him failed him. That pain never goes away. It follows our family every single day.

We are not standing here seeking sympathy. We are standing here seeking accountability. We want meaningful change so that no other family must endure the nightmare we've had since losing Allan.

To those with the authority to make changes, I ask you to remember that behind every report, every policy, and every investigation is human life. Allan was not just another case. He was our son. He was loved. He mattered. His life had value.

The greatest way to honor Allan's memory is to make sure what happened to him never happens to another son, another daughter, another family.

As Allan Tucker's mother, reading the Independent Policing Auditor's findings has been one of the most painful experiences of my life. No mother should have to read an official report stating that her child repeatedly asked for medical help, pleaded to go to the hospital, and was ignored by police officers Chelse Henry, Adam Clements, and William McGinnis, who had sworn to protect and serve.

What makes that pain even harder to bear is that the report identifies systemic breakdowns, individual misconduct, policy violations, inadequate supervision, and gaps in accountability. To me, these are not merely administrative findings; they are moments when my son needed compassion, urgency, and humanity, yet those needs went unmet. Behind every violation is a family forever changed and a community left to question whether this tragedy could have been prevented. These findings are not just words on paper; they reflect the irreversible loss of a son, a brother, a friend, and a life that mattered.

That loss is especially troubling because it is the second critical incident involving the Alexandria Police Department in roughly nine months to end in the loss of a human life, underscoring the urgent need for accountability and reform.

For that reason, I believe this report should serve as a wake-up call for Police Chief McGuire. I hope you recognize the fear my son must have felt while in the custody of your officers, and the profound harm caused when their actions failed to meet the ethical and moral standards the public has every right to expect. You have stated, "You joined this profession because you desired to serve and help people." Those words must now be matched by action. True leadership is not measured by statements made after a tragedy, but by the willingness to confront failures, hold people accountable, and implement meaningful changes that prevent another family from enduring this unimaginable pain.

That same standard of accountability must also apply to Sheriff Sean Casey's response. Rather than fully acknowledging the serious concerns raised about the Sheriff's Office's intake procedures, communication failures, oversight deficiencies, and the prolonged shift-change delay identified in the Auditor's report, his statement appeared to place primary responsibility on the Alexandria Police Department. Every agency involved must be examined, but accountability cannot be selective. Public trust is weakened when leaders deflect responsibility instead of confronting failures within their own organizations. True leadership requires acknowledging those failures, correcting them, and working together to ensure no other family is left grieving a preventable loss.

That is why I respectfully urge the State, Mayor Gaskins and the Alexandria City Council to take immediate action by monitoring funding for the Alexandria Sheriff's Office until meaningful accountability, transparency, and reform are demonstrated. The Council has a duty to ensure that taxpayer dollars support agencies that uphold the highest standards of professionalism, public safety, and constitutional responsibility standards that were not upheld in my son's case. Budget decisions are among the most powerful tools available to demand meaningful change when public institutions fail the people they are sworn to protect.

Above all, Allan deserved better. He deserved compassion when he asked for help, urgency when his life was in danger, and humanity from those entrusted with his care. Every person taken
