



- Traffic and Parking Board Subcommittee Meeting #1 – January 23



Overview & History




*“Unless otherwise controlled by an official sign, **the parking of any vehicle in the same place on the streets of the city for more than 72 hours is prohibited;** provided that this provision shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in the same place on the streets of the city on Saturday, Sunday and holidays.”*


History of Rule



- Alexandria's 72-hour parking rule dates to 1963
- Similar rules exist nationwide
- Supports availability of parking spaces in urban environments with high-demand for off-street spaces





Options Under Review

As seen on AlexEngage Questionnaire

Maintain the 72-Hour Rule




Pros

- encourages parking turnover, which increases availability of parking spaces
- cost neutral option

Cons

- does not address some residents' enforcement concerns about complaints
- no solution for residents who need to park longer than 72 hours

Increase Time Beyond 72 Hours




Pros

- provides additional time, potentially supporting needs of travelers while maintaining enforcement ability

Cons

- additional time reduces parking turnover on neighborhood streets, which reduces parking availability
- does not **fully** address some residents' enforcement concerns about complaints

Repeal Ordinance Completely




Pros

- addresses some residents' enforcement concerns by removing enforcement tool
- parking becomes effectively "first come first served"

Cons

- reduces parking turnover and parking availability
- no tools for police to use in response to complaints

Use Street Sweeping Signage




Pros

- encourages weekly turnover of parking spaces
- promotes clean streets
- with standardization of restriction times, residents know what to expect

Cons

- significant cost of additional machinery, labor, and signage
- some streets do not require weekly sweeping
- with standardization of restriction times, residents know what to expect

Institute a Travel Permit System




Pros

- balances parking availability with the needs of travelers
- limited impact to parking turnover and availability as the travel permit system will likely have a small number of users at one time

Cons

- requires outreach
- consideration of logistics
 - limits on timing
 - potential cost
 - limits on number of permits issued per year





