

Payne & Fayette Sewer Separation Project



The City of Alexandria has begun a project to improve the Combined Sewer System in Old Town Alexandria. The work will include the installation of five manholes and the associated sanitary sewer piping to re-direct sanitary sewer flows from the combined sewer system to the separate sanitary sewer system.


Purpose of the Project

Modern sanitary sewers are meant to carry only wastewater, which comes from fixtures such as sinks, toilets, bathtubs, and washers. Our Combined Sewer System (CSS), however, carries both wastewater and stormwater. When rainfall occurs, the CSS has overflows into the environment which the City both wants and is required to try to eliminate. This project is a part of that effort.

How Do These Sewer Systems Work?

Separate Sewer Systems: Conveyance system involving two separate sets of pipes, one for carrying only stormwater, and the other for carrying only sanitary flows (wastewater/sewage).

Combined Sewer System: Conveyance system involving single set of pipes that carries both stormwater, and sanitary flows (wastewater/sewage).



This graphic is a representation of what can occur during a rainfall in these two systems.
