Resolution to Alexandria City Council to Support Add On Tax

The Alexandria Transportation Commission hereby finds and declares as follows:

WHEREAS on April 7, 2010, the Alexandria Transportation Commission (the Commission) has adopted a long-range plan of transportation projects designed to meet the City of Alexandria's (City) Strategic Goal for a multimodal transportation network that supports sustainable land use and provides internal mobility and regional connectivity for Alexandrians; and

WHEREAS the Commission has identified a subset of High Priority Projects from among projects included in the Long Range Plan that are intended to improve regional connectivity, support economic development, improve quality of life, and address urgent transportation demands within the City; and

WHEREAS the Commission recognizes that the City's existing capital revenue sources are not sufficient to implement these High Priority Projects within the next twenty years; and

WHEREAS the Commission recognizes that the City is considering adoption of an Add-On Tax on Commercial Property and Small Business Tax Relief (Add-On Tax) as an additional source of revenue in the City's fiscal year 2012 budget, to be dedicated to implementing these High Priority Transportation projects; and

WHEREAS the Commission recognizes that a mix of state, Federal and local funds, in addition to an Add-On Tax, may be required to fully implement the High Priority Projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ALEXANDRIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

1. That the Commission endorses the use of an Add-On Tax for funding these High Priority Projects, and supports the adoption of this revenue source in the City's Fiscal Year 2012 Budget.
2. That the Commission respectfully urges City Council to develop a long-range funding strategy that will identify the full range of funding sources available for capital and operating needs, and the projected timing for implementing the list of High Priority Projects, to help guide future funding decisions by City Council.
3. That the Commission respectfully offers to assist with this endeavor by developing a fully prioritized list of High Priority Transportation projects, which will be reviewed and revised through the annual capital planning process.
