General Description

The Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety at the Department of Criminal Justice Services is pleased to announce the *School Resource Officer and School Administrator Basic Course*. This four and a half day course focuses on working with youth, school safety, school law, and in particular, the functions of School Resource Officers and School Administrators in a PreK-12 school environment. This course is required for all law enforcement officers assigned as SROs to a Virginia public school and includes content mandated by the Code of Virginia.

- Developing the School-Law Enforcement Partnership
- The Roles and Responsibilities of an SRO and School Administrator
- School Climate, and the School Safety
- K-12 Crisis Management and Critical Incident Response
- Security Issues in the School Environment and the School Safety Audit
- Threat Assessment in Virginia Schools
- Legal Issues and Topics Related to Virginia Schools
- Technology Related Search and Seizure
- Adolescent Brain Development
- The Effect of Trauma on the Student
- Mental Health Issues in Adolescents
- Working with Special Populations
- Implicit Bias
- Mediation and De-escalation

Intended Audience

This training is intended for:

- **Current and future School Resource Officers (SROs)** – SRO participants will receive a certificate and Partial In-Service Credit for participation in all segments of this training. *Must be a certified law enforcement officer.*
- **School Administrators who seek an understanding of these essential personnel roles and components of a safe school environment.** *A certificate of participation will be provided. Must be currently employed in a public or private school.*

NOTE: Individuals employed as School Security Officers will need to complete the 2-day SSO class to meet their certification requirements. NORTH OLD TOWN ENGAGEMENT PLAN

On April 19, 2021, a Community Town Hall meeting was held at the Charles Houston Recreation Center to listen and answer questions in reference to the recent shooting on April 6, 2021. The community developed a list of over 74 questions and concerns from wanting to be safe in their own homes, to how they can become involved.

The Alexandria Police Department has been developing a community designed engagement approach and in response to the questions and concerns, will direct this approach to the North Old Town community.

APD's Community Relations Division and Patrol Divisions will focus on engagement strategies towards business contacts and community surveys. A COPs officer will be redirected to work with the currently assigned COPs officer in the specific geographical area impacted by the recent shooting. These officers will work directly with residents and businesses to establish relationships and partnerships to help bring the community together.

- A liaison will be assigned as the Old Town Commons HOA (OTC) Liaison. They will complete Community Liaison Program duties to help the community and department work together to resolve neighborhood concerns. The Community Liaisons within the North Old Town area will engage and solicit input to design community engagement opportunities in their neighborhoods.
- The team will continue to work with City Parks and Recreation to engage youth through programs like "Cooking with Cops."
- A survey will be created to help gauge the community in areas such as safety and security, parking and traffic issues. The survey will solicit input into the best approach for their community. The survey will be used to engage residents and will be distributed by both COPs and patrol officers. A drop box will be located within the Charles Houston Recreation Center to gather completed surveys that are not turned in through other electronic means.
- The Patrol Divisions will have the patrol beats assigned within this geographical area dedicate time to work with COPs officers to interact with the community.
- A business information update form was created. Officers will create relationships with local business owners and managers while gathering important information. These questions will identify emergency points of contact for the businesses as well as information helpful for investigating crimes.
- APD's Traffic Safety Section will provide support where needed based on community feedback through survey results, Alex311 and observed behaviors.

It is our expectation that this engagement strategy will increase the feeling of safety and security within the community and create new and lasting opportunities for the department and the community to work together toward shared goals. This will focus community input to the delivery of police services in their neighborhoods. Approximately mid-June, we will hold a community meeting to follow up with the commitments made by the police department including investigative updates and traffic enforcement results. Based upon this community feedback and a departmental review, we will determine whether the tenets of this plan can serve as a model and be successfully adapted in other communities such as the Chirliagua / Arlandria beginning mid-to-late June.
