

## WATERFRONT PLAN WORK GROUP

### COMMENT BOARD SUMMARY

November 17 – 22, 2011

1. A posting indicating an Environmental Impact Assessment should be performed, reviewed and discussed by the Work Group before a vote is taken on the Waterfront Small Area Plan.
2. A posting indicating that the CAAWP Report has identified some additional tools like alternative methods of funding, grants, more parks, and pedestrian areas for the waterfront.
3. A posting stating that after looking at many waterfront plans, the Waterfront Plan appears to have the highest park/open space ratio to developed land than any other and the writer agrees that the Work Group should finish its work as scheduled.
