



Long Acting Reversible Contraception at AHD Teen Wellness Center:







Alexandria Teen Pregnancy Rate by Race/Ethnicity




Alexandria Teen Pregnancy Rate and Number of Teen Pregnancies

Focus Areas Summary

Trending: Bulk trash dumping in alleys; increased trash notices; decrease in trash hauler noise complaints; deferred maintenance at private properties; winter/spring clean up.

- Twice weekly surveys of Mount Vernon Avenue for trash violations and rodent activity.
- Monitor trash areas at all multi-family properties, issue trash summons when warranted.
- Coordinate with T&ES Solid Waste for bulk trash removal from alleys and other public areas.
