Grant: Leadership Building Projects

Purpose: To support projects that develop the leadership skills and capabilities of adolescent girls and young women between the ages of 12 and 30 in the Jewish community

Funder: Hadassah Foundation

Eligibility: Applicants or their fiscal sponsors must be 501(c)(3) organizations and based in the United States

Deadline: February 5

Amount: Up to \$40,000

Grant: Suicide Prevention Lifeline Crisis Center Follow-Up

Purpose: To support crisis centers that follow-up with individuals at-risk of committing suicide. Awardees will follow up with suicidal persons who contact the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline network and those discharged from a partnering emergency department.

Funder: Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)

Eligibility: Members of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline Crisis Center Network who provide 24-hour coverage and have an established partnership with an emergency department(s)

Deadline: February 11

Amount: Six awards that can last up to three years each. Proposed budgets cannot exceed \$115,000 in total costs (both direct and indirect) for a single year.

Grant: National Creative Placemaking Fund

Purpose: To support projects that focus on a neighborhood (or other geographic community) challenge related to that community in the areas of agriculture/food, economic development, education/youth, environment/energy, health, housing, immigration, public safety, transportation, or workforce development. Projects also must use artists, arts organizations, and/or arts activities to help address that challenge.

Funder: Artplace America

Eligibility: All individuals and organizations

Deadline: Applicants must pre-register by February 16; full applications must be submitted by March 2

Amount: Up to \$500,000

Grant: Research on Measurement of Teen Dating Violence

Purpose: To fund proposals related to teen dating violence or adolescent relationship abuse that advance the accurate and developmentally appropriate measurement of dating violence perpetration and victimization among adolescents and young adults

Funder: National Institute of Justice

Eligibility: States (including territories), units of local government, federally recognized Indian tribal governments (as determined by the Secretary of the Interior) that perform law enforcement functions, non-profit and for-profit organizations (including tribal non-profit and for-profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals

Deadline: March 9

Amount: Two awards for an estimated total of \$500,000 for up to a 36-month period

Grant: Outreach and Services to Victims of Domestic/Dating Violence and Underserved Populations

Purpose: To develop and implement outreach strategies targeted at, and provide victim services to, adult and youth victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking in underserved populations. Grant funds are used to provide enhanced services to underserved populations; build the capacity of both mainstream organizations and organizations serving underserved populations to provide culturally appropriate and inclusive services; and increase training and outreach activities targeted at organizations providing services to underserved populations.

Funder: Office on Violence Against Women

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) nonprofits other than institutions of higher education

Deadline: March 9

Amount: 16 awards of \$300,000

Grant: PreK-8 Preservice Teacher Action Research

Purpose: To provide financial support for action research conducted as a collaborative by university faculty, preservice teachers(s), and classroom teachers(s) seeking to improve their understanding of mathematics in PreK-8 classrooms

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: Applicant must be a current (on or before April 22, 2016) Full Individual or E-Member of NCTM or must teach at a school with a current (on or before April 22, 2016) NCTM Pre-K-8 school membership. The applicant may be either a teacher in the Pre-K-8 classroom, a mathematics coach assigned to work with the classroom(s) where the research will be conducted, or a university mathematics educator. The participating preservice teacher(s) must be in an initial licensure/certification program at the undergraduate level and, at some point during the term of the grant, must be engaged in some form of practicum experience or student teaching.

Deadline: May 6

Grant: Program of Mathematics Study & Active Professionalism Grants

Purpose: To provide financial support for teachers seeking to improve their understanding and appreciation of mathematics by completing course work in school mathematics content and pedagogy working toward an advanced degree, and taking an active professional approach toward teaching mathematics. The proposal may outline a study plan for a one-year, a two-year, or a three-year program. The plan may take several forms, such as a multi-year sequence of summer(s) and evening course work, institutes, graduate programs in mathematics education, or leaves of absence.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: The applicant must be a current (on or before April 22, 2016) Full Individual or E-Member of NCTM or must teach at a school with a current (on or before April 22, 2016) NCTM Pre-K-8 school membership. The applicant must be presently teaching mathematics in grades Pre-K-6 and intend to continue teaching in the next school year.

Deadline: May 6

Amount: One grant of \$24,000

Grant: School In-Service Training Grants (6-8)

Purpose: To provide financial assistance to middle schools for in-service education in mathematics. Costs may include honoraria and expenses for consultants, materials, substitute time, and conference or workshop registrations. While this grant does not fund the purchase of technology, proposals including professional development involving the use of technology to enhance student learning are encouraged.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: Only schools with a current (on or before April 22, 2016) NCTM Pre-K-8 school membership are eligible to apply

Deadline: May 6

Amount: Grants of up to \$4,000 each

While this grant does not fund the purchase of technology, proposals including professional development involving the use of technology to enhance student learning are encouraged.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: Only schools with a current (on or before April 22, 2016) NCTM Pre-K-8 school membership are eligible to apply

Deadline: May 6

Amount: Grants of up to \$4,000 each

Costs may include honoraria and expenses for consultants, materials, substitute time, and conference or workshop registrations. While this grant does not fund the purchase of technology, proposals including professional development involving the use of technology to enhance student learning are encouraged.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: Only schools with at least one current (on or before April 22, 2016) Full Individual or E-Members of NCTM are eligible to apply

Deadline: May 6

Amount: Grants of up to \$4,000

Grant: Enhancing Student Mathematics Learning through the Use of Tools and Technology

Purpose: To encourage the innovative use of technology and other tools to help teachers and students visualize and concretize mathematics abstractions. Materials may include, but not be limited to, books, calculators, tablets, computers, or related equipment as well as professional development in the use of the designated tools and technology.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: The applicant must be a current (on or before April 22, 2016) Full Individual or E-Member of NCTM, or teach at a school with a current (on or before April 22, 2016) NCTM Pre-K-8 school membership and currently teach mathematics in grades Pre-K-12 at least 50% of the school day.

Deadline: May 6

Amount: Grants of up to \$3,000 each

Grant: Professional Development Scholarship Emphasizing the History of Mathematics

Purpose: To provide financial support for completion of credited course work in the history of mathematics or the design and implementation plan for a personal study program with a focus on some aspect of the history of mathematics; creating and field-testing of appropriate classroom activities incorporating the history of mathematics, and preparing and delivering a professional development presentation to colleagues.

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: The applicant must (1) be a current (on or before April 22, 2016) Full Individual or E-Member of NCTM; (2) have taught school mathematics for at least three years; and (3) intend to remain in teaching.

Deadline: May 6

Amount: One scholarship of up to \$3,000

Grant: Prospective 7-12 Secondary Teacher Course Work Scholarships

Purpose: To provide financial support to college students preparing for teaching secondary school mathematics. This scholarship can be applied to tuition, fees, course materials, and other expenses directly related to the recipient's academic program of study. Any acquisition of equipment must support the applicant's plan of study, but not require more than 10% (\$1,000) of the entire scholarship

Funder: National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

Eligibility: A person currently completing their sophomore year of college, scheduling for full-time study at a four- or five-year college or university in the next academic year, and pursuing a career goal of becoming a certified teacher of secondary school mathematics.

Deadline: May 6

Amount: The scholarship will be awarded in two phases, with \$5,000 for the recipient's third year of full-time study, and \$5,000 for the recipient's fourth year of full-time study.

Grant: Neonatal Research

Purpose: To support of research that addresses both the long-term and immediate health needs caused by premature birth as well as the causes of premature birth and ways to prevent it. Research subjects appropriate for support include basic biological processes governing development, genetics, clinical studies, studies of reproductive health, environmental toxicology, and social and behavioral studies.

Funder: Little Giraffe Foundation

Eligibility: Applicants can be a scientist, doctor, or nurse representing a university, hospital, or research institution.

Deadline: Letters on Intent due July 15

Amount: Up to \$10,000
