EDUCATION

Grant: Community Grants

Purpose: To provide education about immigrants and immigration. Applications for immigration-themed projects are considered for all subject areas, although special consideration is given for proposals that relate to the following categories: innovative use of technology or service learning; community outreach and partnerships with community-based organizations; mathematics, science, and the arts; and teaching and learning of fundamental constitutional rights (due process) and border issues

Funder: American Immigration Council

Eligibility: Educators teaching in public or private, intermediate and secondary level schools as well as extension educators and community leaders

Deadline: July 1

Amount: Not specified

Grant: Arts-Integrated Education

Purpose: To support a new or evolving program that integrates the arts into educational programming

Funder: P. Buckley Moss Foundation for Children's Education

Eligibility: PreK-12 educators working in schools that serve all children (including students who learn differently)

Deadline: September 30

Amount: Up to \$1,000

Purpose: To cultivate an indoor or outdoor herb garden

YOUTH WELL-BEING

Purpose: Transitional Living Program Special Population Project: LGBTQ Runaway and Homeless Youth and Young Adults Who Have Left Foster Care After Age 18

Funder: Department of Health and Human Services

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status; for profit organizations other than small businesses; public and state controlled institutions of higher education, private institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities, independent school districts; special district, city, township, county, and state governments; Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized tribal governments), Native American tribal governments

Deadline: August 1

Amount: Eight awards of \$250,000 - \$625,000

Grant: Safe Places to Play

Purpose: Grants are available in four categories: Synthetic Turf, Lighting, Irrigation, and Sport Court. Multi-sport field projects are eligible for funding, but such fields must be used a majority of the time for soccer.

Multi-field projects are also eligible. All grants (except for Irrigation) can be awarded for either indoor or outdoor field projects.

Funder: U.S. Soccer Foundation

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) organizations that offer soccer-specific programming directly or through partnerships

Deadline: Letters of Intent are due September 30; applications are due October 7

Amount: Varies

Grant: Youth Bereavement Support Services

Purpose: To support organizations that provide bereavement support services and grief counseling to children and teens who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling, or loved one

Funder: A Little HOPE

Eligibility: Organizations

Deadline: Open; grant applications are by invitation only and are sent to potential grant recipients during the month of October each year. To be considered, email name of program, website address, name of executive director, name of program director, and the location of program. No other information is needed or will be processed.

Grant: Healthcare Management Research Projects

Purpose: To support an innovative research project with the potential to advance the existing knowledge base in the areas of healthcare financing, delivery, management, and/or policy

Funder: National Institute for Health Care Management Foundation

Eligibility: Individual researchers and all types of organizations and institutions, including both nonprofit and for-profit entities

Deadline: Letters of Inquiry due July 11

Amount: Five grants totaling \$250,000

Grant: Suicide Prevention

Purpose: To support innovative, potentially high-yield solutions that focus on short-term risk for suicide that can be readily implemented in clinical settings. Projects also can focus on the development of universal, selective, or indicated interventions that target one or more specific risk factors for suicide and that, if implemented on a large scale, would reduce the U.S. national suicide rate. In addition, the program supports innovative studies in new areas of investigation with the potential to impact the understanding and prevention of suicide.

Funder: American Foundation for Suicide Prevention

Eligibility: Researchers in all fields of inquiry

Deadline: Letters of Inquiry due August 1

Amount: Up to \$500,000 per year for up to three years

Grant: Social and Environmental Issues

Purpose: Grants will be awarded to projects in one or more of the following areas: Children and Families (programs that foster family self-sufficiency and stability); Environment (programs that teach practical, everyday methods of conservation, protection, and the responsible use of natural resources); and Disenfranchised Groups (people who have been marginalized in society because of their low levels of skill, education or income, people with disabilities, and people who are homeless). Projects most likely to be considered are those which help people overcome social or economic barriers to education or employment;

promote the empowerment of individuals toward self-sufficiency, and provide opportunities for personal growth that benefit their greater community; demonstrate human equality and encourage people to cross boundary lines to help others.

Funder: Singing for Change

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) organizations

Deadline: Ongoing

Amount: \$1,000 to \$10,000
