Grant: Child Welfare, Family Support, Housing, and Environmental Program Grants

Purpose: To fund projects in three areas: Child Abuse (initiatives to eliminate the sexual exploitation of children, engage men and boys in combating the sexual abuse of children, and promote systemic approaches to prevent violence against children); Housing and Homelessness (preventing homelessness by funding sustainable solutions that improve the economic and social well-being of marginalized youth, adults and families); and the Environment (the conservation of marine resources and the mitigation of climate change).

Funder: Oak Foundation

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations

Deadline: Ongoing

Amount: \$25,000+

Grant: Public Land Events

Purpose: To fund educational, recreational, and/or volunteer-based events that take place on a public land site that is owned by the public and not just open for public use

Funder: National Environmental Education Foundation

Eligibility: Public land organizations and friends groups

Deadline: Pre-proposals are due December 15

Amount: Up to \$2,000

Grant: Nutrition for Low-Income Consumers

Purpose: To support efforts to increase the purchase of fruits and vegetables among low-income consumers participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) by providing incentives at the point of purchase. The program will test strategies that could contribute to an understanding of how best to increase the purchase of fruits and vegetables by SNAP participants that would inform future efforts, and develop effective and efficient benefit redemption technologies.

Funder: Department of Agriculture

Eligibility: Government agencies and nonprofit organizations

Deadline: December 16

Amount: Approximately \$16.8 million is available in FY 2016

Grant: Primary Care Training and Enhancement Program

Purpose: To strengthen the primary care workforce by supporting enhanced training for future primary care clinicians, teachers, and researchers. Projects that address the social determinants of health while addressing health care delivery transformation are encouraged.

Funder: Health Resources and Services Administration

Eligibility: Public or nonprofit private hospitals, school of allopathic or osteopathic medicine, academically affiliated PA training programs, or a public or nonprofit private entity that has been determined to be capable of carrying out such grants. Faith-based and community-based organizations, tribes and tribal organizations may apply if otherwise eligible.

Deadline: December 16

Amount: \$14,937,979 is available for 37 awards

Grant: Humanities Education Grants

Purpose: To support projects for general audiences that encourage active engagement with humanities ideas in creative and appealing ways. Many different formats are supported, including permanent and traveling exhibitions, book or film discussion programs, historic site or district interpretations, living history presentations, and other face-to-face programs in public venues.

Funder: National Endowment for the Humanities

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without a 501(c)(3) status; private institutions of higher education, public and state controlled institutions of higher education; city or township governments, county governments, special district governments, Native American tribal governments

Deadline: January 13, 2016

Amount: Up to \$1,000,000

Grant: ArtsLink Projects

Purpose: To provide grants to U.S. artists, curators, presenters, and arts organizations undertaking projects in any of the 37 eligible countries. Applicants must be working with an artist or organization in the targeted region and projects should be designed to benefit participants in both the U.S. and the host country. Applications will be accepted from individual artists, presenters, and nonprofit arts organizations working in the performing arts and literature.

Funder: CEC Artslink

Eligibility: Individuals and nonprofit arts organizations

Grant: Criminal Justice Research Projects

Purpose: To build an evidence base about the approaches, innovations, and strategies that work best to improve public safety as well as increase the fairness and efficiency of the criminal justice system. Preference will be given to research projects that are focused on the front end of the criminal justice system (the period of time between arrest and case resolution) and on mental health and substance use disorders. This includes topics such as policing, prosecution, alternative to arrest, diversion, juvenile justice, and medication-assisted treatment.

Funder: Laura and John Arnold Foundation

Eligibility: All organizations are eligible to apply, including local jurisdictions and universities

Deadline: Letters of Interest must be received no later than January 15, 2016

Amount: Up to \$12 million to fund at least four randomized controlled trials, and \$2 million to fund innovative, early-stage research projects that, if successful, could advance the to the stage of randomized controlled trials

Grant: Youth-Led Hunger Service Projects

Purpose: To fund youth-led service projects that bring together young people, families, Sodexo employees, and other community members to address childhood hunger. Projects will take place on or around Global Youth Service Day, April 15-17, 2016.

Grant: Health Safety Net Grants

Purpose: To support organizations that work to increase access to primary care for uninsured Virginians and those who live in areas with limited access to care. The focus of funding is projects that address one or more of these priorities: developing or expanding patient capacity, establishing a broader scope of services, creating local systems of care, and strengthening the infrastructure of health care providers.

Funder: Virginia Health Care Foundation

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations and public agencies, including free clinics, community health centers, and other similar organizations

Deadline: The deadline for the first concept paper is January 15, 2016.

Grant: National Center for Child Traumatic Stress

Purpose: To develop and maintain a collaborative network structure, support resource and policy development and dissemination, and coordinate the network's national child trauma education and training efforts

Funder: SAMHSA

Eligibility: Domestic public and private nonprofit entities, including state and local governments; federally recognized American Indian/Alaska Native tribes and tribal organizations

Deadline: January 20, 2016

Amount: One award of up to \$6,000,000 for up to five years

Grant: Childhood Obesity Research Demonstration Grants

Purpose: To implement and test the ability of a model of clinical childhood obesity management along with an Electronic Health Record(EHR)-referral-based, family-centered pediatric weight management program to reduce body mass index (BMI) in children with obesity, or overweight with risks (including, e.g., medical and behavioral risks, and family history). Health outcomes of interest include measurable changes in BMI, nutrition and physical activity behaviors, health care satisfaction and service delivery, and quality of life.

Funder: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without a 501(c)(3), small businesses, private institutions of higher education, public and state controlled institutions of higher education, city or township governments, county governments, independent school districts, state governments, special district governments, public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities, Native American tribal organizations, Native American tribal governments (federally recognized).

Deadline: January 29, 2016

Amount: Two awards of up to \$1,750,000

Grant: Five Star/Urban Waters Restoration Program

Purpose: To provide modest financial assistance for wetland, forest, riparian and coastal habitat restoration, stormwater management, outreach, and stewardship projects, with a particular focus on water quality, watersheds, and the habitats they support

Funder: National Fish and Wildlife Foundation

Eligibility: Non-profit 501(c) organizations, state government agencies, local governments, municipal governments, Indian tribes, and educational institutions

Deadline: February 3, 2016

Amount: \$20,000 to \$50,000; a minimum one-to-one match of cash and/or in-kind/contributed goods and services to the amount requested is required

Grant: Housing Needs of Military Veterans

Purpose: To award grants for the development and repair of veterans housing. Eligible projects include new construction or the rehab or repair of single or multifamily permanent supportive or transitional housing. Preference will be given to projects that serve the housing needs of women veterans with children, post-9/11 wounded veterans, veterans with caregivers, homeless veterans, and senior veterans aging in place.

Funder: Home Depot Foundation

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations in good standing with the Internal Revenue Service for at least five years; have an operating budget of at least \$300,000; and have developed or either currently manage or own veteran-specific housing

Deadline: February 24, 2016

Amount: Awards typically range from \$100,000 to \$500,000
