PARK/OPEN SPACES			
1.	Lighting on Four Mile Run Park path	PZ/ RPCA / TES	Staff surveyed the area following the community walk and documented all nonworking or broken light fixtures. Staff is working with Dominion to repair and/or replace – potential completion date forthcoming.
2.	Metal / debris along path in Four Mile Run Park	RPCA	Staff has been notified and will ensure it is collected.
3.	Community request to work with MOMs to install screening between the dumpsters and recycling area and the park (soon to be playground).	RPCA	Staff will work with MOMs to address this request.
4.	Overgrown vegetation on Four Mile Run Park near wetlands path causing accessibility issues	RPCA	Site is on schedule to have the edge mowed.
5.	Community concern with inappropriate gathering/behavior at the far end of the wetlands trail.	APD/RPCA	APD patrol units have been informed of the activity in this area and will amplify presence.
6.	Community concern related to Four Mile Run Park mowing cycle – have there been any reductions in budget to accommodate mowing?	RPCA	There have been no reductions in the current budget to the existing mowing cycle; however, there are specific areas throughout the park that differ in mowing cycles.
7.	Trim growth surrounding the COA-101 photo monitoring tool post at wetlands – tool cannot be used with when foliage is blocking its view.	RPCA	The “Chronolog bracket” referred to here is on schedule with the Natural Lands staff to inspect every 2 weeks during the growing season and cut back to accommodate the photo logs.
8.	Community request to install recycle cans in Four Mile Run Park.	TES	TES is not currently expanding the public space recycling program due to very high levels of contamination. Current focus is on education and outreach to reduce contamination. Location will be noted for future consideration.
