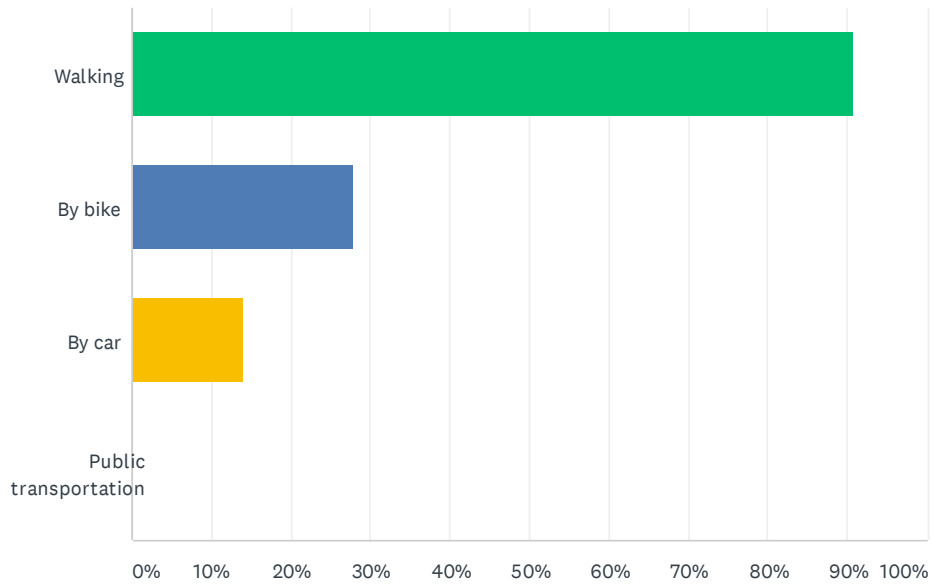

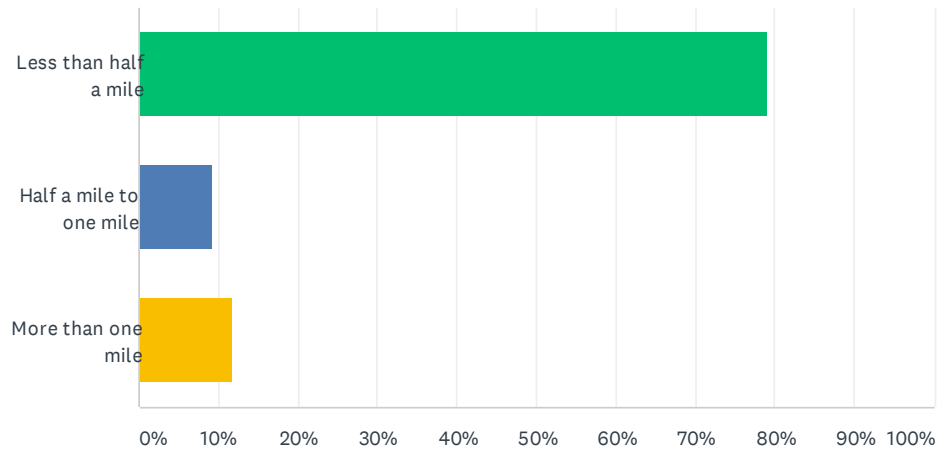

## Q2 How far do you travel to get to this park? (Select one.)

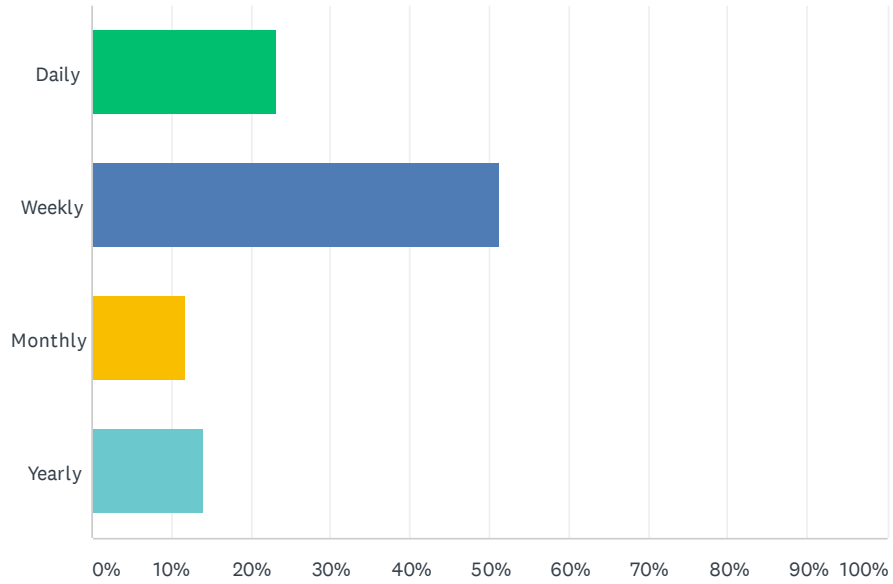

### Q3 How often do you use the park? (Select one.)

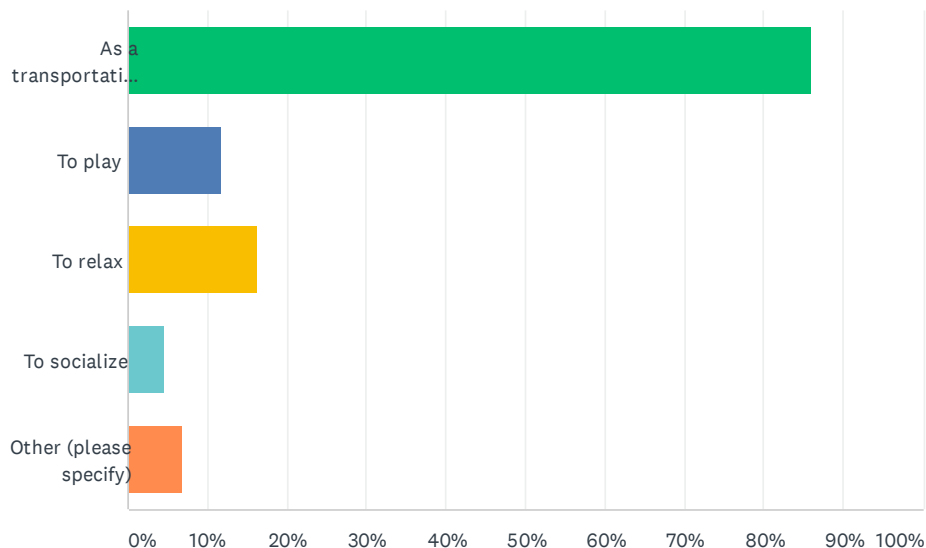

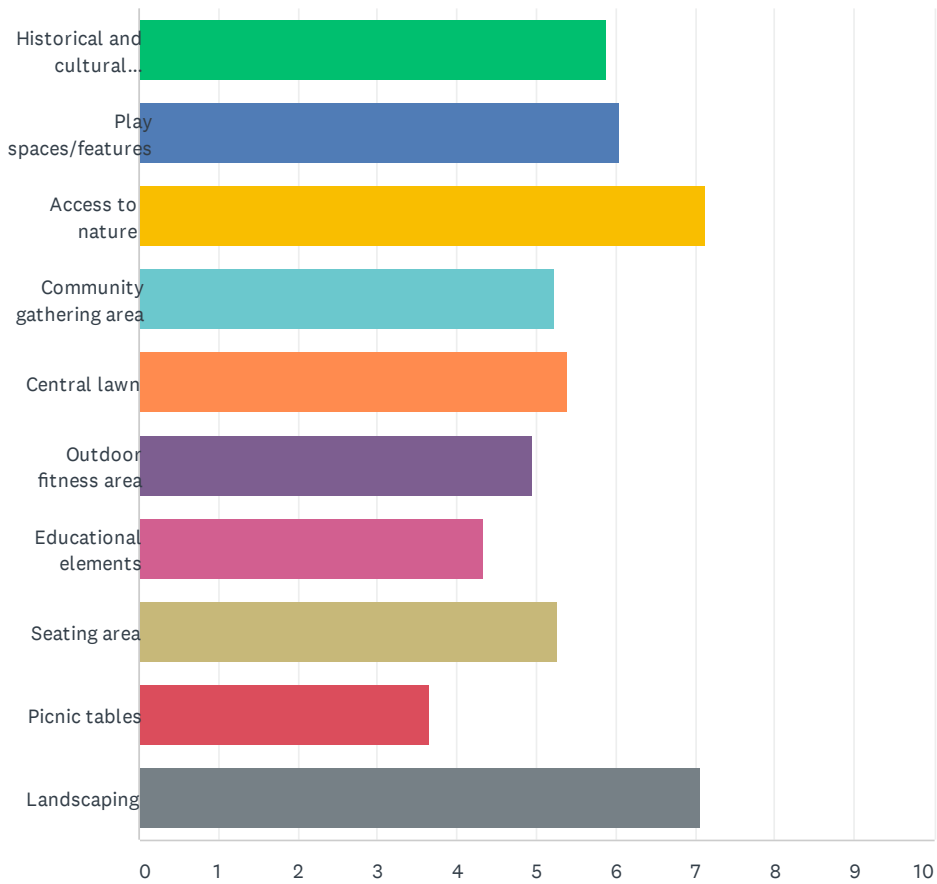
