RECREATION PROGRAMS AND SERVICES REPORT**

Program Wrap-ups

- 6 students received RedCross certification after completing Babysitting Training at Charles Houston Recreation Center. Designed to prepare young adults to give quality childcare and the tools to start their own childcare business, the program met its 100% cost recovery goal.
- On Saturday, June 21, Cora Kelly Recreation Center hosted its Community Day to celebrate the diverse community with fun-filled activities for all ages and to provide relationship building opportunities between the public and staff. Over 250 residents participated in the activities, including games, arts & crafts, face painting, moon bounce and community information booths.



- William Ramsay Recreation Center’s weekly senior ping pong is an on-going success with a steady attendance of 12 or more participants per session.

- The first Alexandria Titans Football Combine Clinic was held on Saturday, June 14 with 82 children ages 5-16. Kids and parents appreciated the free NFL-style training session and concluded the program with pizza and drinks courtesy of the coaches and Titans Booster Club. The standard pre-season camp is scheduled for July 28-31 with 125-150 participants predicted.



- The Hershey's Virginia State Track & Field Championships were held on Saturday, June 21 in Crozet, Virginia. Alexandria's Guilem Bansa finished 1st and Erika Van Dyke finished 2nd in the girls (11/12) 400 Meter run. For the second year in a row, John Colucci placed in the 13/14 1600 Meter Run. He finished ninth in the nation in 2013. Colucci will advance to the North American Hershey Track and Field Finals in Hershey, Pennsylvania at the end of July.



Section Updates

- Sports Section:
Youth sports programs are reporting strong participation numbers:
 - Johnson & Siebert Summer Basketball League (ages 12-14) – 70 participants
 - National Junior NJTL Tennis Program (ages 8-16) – 45 participants
 - Summer Instructional Baseball League (ages 6-8) – 75 participants
 - Alexandria Titans Track and Field Club (ages 7-14) – 70 participants
 - Girls Field Hockey Program (ages 9-14) – 198 participants



“Rock Your Park” Open Play is taking place July 5-August 17. Enjoy free access to the synthetic turf fields at Ben Brenman Park, Witter Recreational Park and Francis Hammond Middle School. Also, natural turf fields are available at Eugene Simpson Park and Four Mile Run Park. Four Mile Run Park and Ben Brenman Park on Saturday and Sunday 10 a.m.-6 p.m. and Eugene Simpson Park 2-6 p.m. Four Mile Run Park and Hammond Park are also available on Tuesdays and Thursdays 6-9 p.m.

Sports staff is currently working on developing plans to transition the Titans Football program from a City run program to a community run program by the 2016 season. Future updates will be provided.

- Nannie J. Lee Recreation Center:
After exploring the possibility of combining Little Dippers and the Mainstream After-School program with the general recreation Out of School Time program (OSTP) at Nannie J. Lee Recreation Center, it was decided to reposition the existing TR program and add a new afterschool program option due to low enrollment in the existing program. The new Therapeutic Recreation after school program will afford participants inclusion opportunities and is therefore being named the ‘Mainstream Program’ and will cost \$100 per month as compared to the previous \$65 per month for the full school year of TR programs and brings the program closer to its cost-recovery target.

The new afterschool option for general recreation participants provides parents the option of participating in the existing Out of School Time program at Charles Houston or enrolling in Nannie J. Lee’s new 100% cost-recovery afterschool program ‘Youth Achieving Greatness’. Participants will be thoroughly engaged in structured enrichment activities that will increase their learning and independence, as well as their social, life and leadership skills. This specialized program will be fun with a purpose which

integrates a variety of activities, such as tutoring, physical fitness, cooking, chess, gymnastics, music, cooperative games and much more. Children will benefit from a 1:15 staff to participant ratio and smaller class sizes. The cost is \$940 per school year as compared to the new Out of School Time fee of \$415 per school year.

- Charles Houston Recreation Center has shown a 25% increase in revenue from center-based programs, room reservations, soft play room use and fitness pass sales compared to last year.

Upcoming Events

- **National Night Out** will take place on Tuesday, August 5 as part of a National Crime Prevention program where communities gather for free activities, including informative seminars, cookouts, safety demonstrations and more, to heighten crime prevention awareness and enhance community relations. Charles Houston Recreation Center and all the 3 outdoor pool locations will host activities.
- Charles Houston Recreation Center will be hosting the following events:
 - Adults ages 18 and over are invited to **Jazz by the Pool** on Friday, August 15 from 7 to 10 p.m. at Memorial Pool. This new way of winding down includes relaxing by the pool while enjoying progressive jazz by Vaughn Ambrose. The cost is \$5 per person.
 - Charles Houston's Advisory Council **Community Day** will be held on Saturday, August 9 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The event is expected to include fitness demonstrations, carnival style games and inflatables in the gymnasium, refreshment sales and prize drawings. In addition, information booths will give community residents an opportunity to learn about our recreational programs and services.
 - On Saturday, August 16 and Wednesday, August 27, families can enjoy free **Dive In Movies** at Memorial Pool and its surrounding lawn. The family-friendly features will begin at 7 p.m. and include "Frozen" and "G-Force."
- As part of Summer Out of School Time fun:
 - William Ramsay Recreation Center will feature **Bright Star Theatre's** performance of "George Washington Carver" on Monday, July 28 at 3:30 p.m. for children ages 5-12.
 - Patrick Henry Recreation Center will host **Summer Quest**, storytelling by Christylez Bacon, for children ages 6-12 on Wednesday, July 16 at 2 p.m.

Enhancements

- Charles Houston Recreation Center is purchasing two new treadmills for its Fitness Center. The equipment is expected to arrive in two weeks. The purchase and anticipated arrival date of new Soft Play Equipment for the Soft Play Room and Lil Gymmies is in twelve weeks. The equipment for both program service areas is expected to increase attendance and enrollment.
- Fluorescent lights in the men's and women's locker rooms at Chinquapin will be replaced with energy efficient LED lights by the end of July.

- A communication plan is being implemented to inform the public about two new service enhancements: the implementation of a Registration & Reservation Office and a registration management system update.

A Registration & Reservation Office is now open to provide customers with a one-stop-shop to get information about recreation programs and services; register for programs such as classes, camps and leagues; and make room and picnic reservations. The office is housed at the Lee Center and is open for walk-in or phone support (703.746.5414) Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. Staff are available to assist patrons in both English and Spanish, with translation services available upon request.

A postcard was mailed to 14,000 active households informing them that the Department's registration management system, used to sign up for programs and manage room and picnic reservations, is being updated. The update will take place on August 1 and will ensure that household information on file is accurate, make it easier for patrons to find the programs they're interested in and provide the Department with reliable data to ensure that the programs being offered meet the community's needs. To complete the update, existing customers must create new accounts, including household and contact information. Beginning August 1, accounts can be created online or in-person at the Registration & Reservation Office.

Communication mediums include the City website, direct mail, displays in recreation centers, Citywide eNews, social media, an FAQ for staff and the public, and a print advertisement in the upcoming Program Guide (shown above).

- The Program Guide is continuing to be enhanced with the goal of improving usability and being one resource for all Department offerings. In conjunction with the registration management system update, all Department service areas are being re-organized into 11 overarching program categories, including: aquatics, exercise & fitness, sports classes & league, enrichment, creative & performing arts, camps, environmental education, out of school time, community events, special events and facilities & parks. The Fall program Guide will be available by August 1, 2014.

Staff Updates

- William Ramsay Recreation Center welcomes Recreation Coordinator Rodney Bates from Nannie J. Lee Recreation Center. Mr. Bates' background in fitness education will be well-suited to the growing demands for fitness programs in the western region of the city.

- The Department received a letter from a community member recognizing staff members of the Cora Kelly Recreation Center for their service to the community. “I wanted to take this time to thank you again for making a decision that perhaps saved a young black male from a path of self-doubt, mistrust and demoralized self-esteem... Kudos to Cisco Fabian, Tim Catron and Tara Jackson for the dedication they have for the work they do”.
- On June 28, Recreation Center managers participated in VERTEX, Virginia Emergency Response Training Exercise as part of a larger state-wide exercise in partnership with the Office of Emergency Management, the American Red Cross and the Alexandria Health Department. Staff and volunteers with the Alexandria Medical Reserve Corps set up and operated a test shelter at the Lee Center to prepare for emergency sheltering when Alexandria residents may be displaced from their homes. The exercise was a resounding success as 45 residents were processed within a two hour timeframe. The American Red Cross’ Disaster Program Specialist Michael Canatgallo sent a letter stating “If the residents of Alexandria ever find themselves in need of shelter, I know your staff will rise to the challenge and acquit themselves with both professionalism and good will.”

SUBJECT: PARK OPERATIONS UPDATE – ITEM V-B.

1. PARK MAINTENANCE AND PARK FACILITIES:

The park and facilities maintenance staff continues to inspect and maintain all parks and park facilities through a combination of routine and preventative maintenance activities such as the 14 day large area mowing cycle, daily restroom maintenance, litter patrol, graffiti removal, trail maintenance, routine playground and park inspections, and athletic field maintenance and grooming.

Staff provided support for City-sponsored special events, including the City's Annual Birthday Celebration on July 13th.

Staff responded to work requests generated from the City's Call, Click, Connect portal. These requests are first evaluated by an on-site inspection to determine the appropriate response. Safety related items are given the first priority for staff response.

Staff is coordinating the implementation of several park enhancement projects funded through the capital (CFMP) funding. Example of these projects includes; the City-wide park furniture replacement using the established park facility standards, rehabilitation for several basketball and tennis courts, refurbishment of the trail around All Veteran's Park and the rehabilitation of park restroom facilities, including the restrooms in Ft. Ward Park. Staff has commenced installing City Standard picnic tables, park benches, player benches, trash and recycling cans, backstops, throughout the Hensley, Ben Brenman, Four Mile and Simpson Districts. These installations will continue throughout the summer and into the fall.

Facilities Maintenance: Staff continues inspecting irrigation systems conducting regular maintenance, repairs and seasonal clock programming. Due to lack of rainfall and warmer temperatures we are experiencing drought conditions in several areas in the City. Staff is increasing water regimen where irrigation system is available.

Maintenance Contract: Mowing program for rights-of-way, schools, public facilities is on schedule for the 14-day mowing cycle beginning July 14, 2014. Mowing schedules have been posted on City's website for public information <http://www.alexandriava.gov/18076>

Alleys Refuse Clearing Service: Our contractors continue alley clean-up as requested by T&ES and Code Administration. The scope of work is to maintain trees and other vegetation in alleys to ensure (18 feet high and 10 feet wide) access for City's refuse collection vehicles.

Fixed Asset Inventory: Annual fixed asset inventory and physical verification of all RPCA vehicles and equipment has been completed.

Vehicle/Equipment Replacement: All vehicles and equipment due for replacement in FY2014 have been procured.

Park Light Inspection: Seasonal inspection of all lights in parks has been completed. Repairs to RPCA managed lights have been made and Dominion Power has been notified of light repairs under their jurisdictions. In addition to the three annual inspections, this is an on-going task for the staff.

2. NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

a. **Natural Lands Management**

Environmental Review: Staff provided environmental review comments regarding Four Mile Run soil analyses and proposed use of excavated fill; Mt. Jefferson Park & Greenway vegetation surveys and assessments with regards to impending development of adjoining warehouses; assessment and field meeting of proposed joint NPS project to control/eradicate invasive plants (*Phramites* and *Ampelopsis*) at Potomac Greens Park.

Natural Resource Management and Notable Trees: Added the new 4th largest known Blackjack Oak in Virginia to the state register of big trees.

Staff assisted a Ph.D. student with the Agrawal lab at the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at Cornell University in surveying City of Alexandria sites for the Milkweed Stem Weevil.



Staff oversaw invasive plant control and major non-native invasive plant removal project to eradicate Callery Pear, Siberian Elm, and other noxious weeds from the Telegraph and Duke Meadow.



b. Horticulture Program

In addition to our regular schedule of seasonal horticultural maintenance activities at public facilities throughout the City, we have also implemented the following projects during the past month:

- Participated in the Charles Barrett School Community Service Day. We provided plants, mulch and tools for 50 Fifth Grade students for beautifying the entrance to Charles Barrett Recreation Center.
- Drastic pruning of the Bastion hedges at Ft. Ward Park, and weeding and trash pickup in preparation for the War of 1812 re-enactment July 4th weekend.
- Continued survey and treatment for ticks at Ft. Ward Park, old maintenance yard area.
- Addition of a second bee-keeper to the Chinquapin Community Gardens.
- Worked with Park Planning Interns to develop a plan for the Braddock/Commonwealth Dog Park, using appropriate plant varieties.
- Completed several prunings of Rights-of-Ways, clearing of sidewalks for Code Enforcement.

c. Jerome “Buddie” Ford Nature Center

The Naturalist staff of the Jerome “Buddie” Ford Nature Center conducted 53 interpretive programs in June that were attended by 891 participants. Some program and operational highlights are described below:

Career Day at Maury Elementary School: On June 13, the Nature center staff was invited to participate at Maury Elementary School’s annual Career Day. More than 250 students visited the Nature Center’s table. Naturalists Jane Yeingst and Arianna Kelly explained what the daily routine at the center entails as well as the many skills required for our positions. Students got a close-up look at some of the native and exotic animals. See photos below.

Tadpole Camp: The first nature camp of the summer was conducted June 23 to 27. This week long program, for ages 3 to 4, focused on animal groups. The campers enjoyed learning about the many animals at the nature center, hiking in the park and creating daily craft projects. See photos below.

A Note about Dora Kelley Nature Park: There had been much concern about several sewage spills up stream in Holmes Run and major flooding from storms earlier in the Spring, during the mating season, the adult amphibian population in the marsh appeared to be fewer than in years past. Surprisingly by late Spring, there were large numbers of juvenile amphibians. Many wood frog tadpoles and spotted salamander with gills were thriving in the marsh. See photos below.

Proposal to Name City Pocket Park in Memory of Judy Lowe

The City of Alexandria is seeking public comment on a proposal to rename 1 & 7 East Del Ray Avenue Pocket Park, located at the intersection of E. Del Ray and Commonwealth Avenues, the Judy Lowe Pocket Park. The Del Ray Citizens Association forwarded the proposal.

Judith "Judy" Utterback Lowe loved Alexandria and the Del Ray neighborhood. She believed intensely in preserving and enhancing a sense of community. Judy was well known as the "First Lady of Del Ray," because of her involvement in many civic activities. While alive, Judy appreciated the fact that it was a grassroots effort of neighborhood activists who convinced the City to buy the land at 1 & 7 E. Del Ray Ave. for the creation of a neighborhood pocket park.

The public is invited to provide comment on the proposal to rename the park the "Judy Lowe Pocket Park" through Friday, July 25.

Windmill Hill Park Bulkhead Replacement Project

The City received multiple proposals for the replacement of the Windmill Hill Park bulkhead. Staff completed the initial evaluation and final negotiations are underway. Contract award anticipated in August. Community input will begin in the fall with construction activities to in fall 2015.

Marina Dredging Project

Design activities for scheduled dredging is complete. Dredging activities will begin in November 2014 with completion by February 2015.

City Marina Wharf Strengthening Project

The City received no proposals by the extended July 7 deadline. Staff is preparing construction documents with specifications for advertisement. Construction activities will not result in service disruptions in the City Marina and will take approximately one week to complete.

HIGHLIGHTED ITEMS IN BRIEF:

Eisenhower West Small Area Planning Process

The Department of Planning and Zoning will be briefing the Park and Recreation Commission on the status of this Small Area Plan. Background information is provided below, with additional information available at the following link: <http://www.alexandriava.gov/EisenhowerWest>. A map of the planning area is attached.

The FY2014 Interdepartmental Work Program approved by City Council on May 29, 2013 identified the Eisenhower West Small Area Plan (SAP) as the major planning effort to begin in FY 2014. The small area planning process began in early 2014 and is anticipated to be complete 18 months later in mid-late 2015. Larger community meetings compliment the steering committee work, focusing on issue identification, visioning, and the plan framework. Online engagement plays an integral role in updating the public on the progression of the planning process, and providing a platform for polling, comments, and feedback on specific questions. At Council's direction, staff will look at options for completing the plan as expeditiously as possible.

The planning process also includes the Eisenhower West Steering Committee, which provides guidance on process related issues, including review and input on the proposed engagement process, the small area plan boundary, tools and strategies for engagement, agenda setting, community outreach and communications, among other tasks. The steering committee will also weigh in on technical content elements, such as the project scopes and development scenarios for consideration in the transportation study. An associated Eisenhower West Transportation Study is underway and is anticipated to be complete by Spring 2015.

Oakville Triangle/Route 1 Corridor - Planning Process Update

At the January 2014 City Council work session on the proposed FY 2015 interdepartmental planning work program, staff indicated that the owner of Oakville Triangle would like to redevelop their 13 acre (approximate) property. The owner, an entity owned by The Blackstone Group, agreed to fund consultant services and staffing so that the City could begin planning and process the associated applications beginning in FY 2014. A nine member Oakville Triangle and Route 1 Corridor Advisory Group was established by City Council Resolution in March 2014, with membership selected by the City Manager after a public nomination process. The Advisory Group provides advice to City staff on the planning and associated regulatory submissions for the area, specifically assisting in developing Plan principles regarding potential land uses, open space, sustainability, transportation and connectivity issues, as well as potential community benefits.

The scope of the planning effort includes Oakville Triangle and adjacent properties as well as the Route 1 corridor north and south of the site. The planning process is well underway and the community is involved in assisting in developing Plan principles for the site regarding potential land uses, open space, sustainability, transportation and connectivity, and potential community benefits, among other topics. The corridor study will review features such as streetscaping, undergrounding of utilities, and potential redevelopment sites along the western portion of Route 1. The corridor study will help to establish a unified streetscape for Route 1 and an integrated approach to potential redevelopment along Route 1.

Armistead Boothe Park Renovation:

Armistead L. Boothe Park, located at 520 Cameron Station Blvd., is under construction. Several areas of the park will be closed during this renovation, including the picnic shelter, playgrounds, tennis courts, basketball court, and parking lot. The ballfield will remain open during construction. The construction will include the relocation and renovation of the playgrounds, rubberized safety surfacing, resurfacing the basketball and tennis courts, and other site work. Anticipated completion of park improvements is early summer 2014. This project is funded by contributions from Restaurant Dept, Alexandria City Public Schools, and various Park CIP funds. The project is at approximately 90% completion.

Braddock Neighborhood Interim Open Space (600 N. Henry St.)

The Park and Recreation Commission approved a concept plan for interim improvements to the Braddock Open Space in January 2014. The building at 600 North Henry Street is scheduled for demolition beginning in June. Following demolition, implementation of the approved plan will begin, with completion expected over the summer. A group of neighbors from Braddock Lofts submitted an agreement to adopt the new open space once it's complete. An RFP for design the future, full one acre park on that block has been solicited and proposals are currently under staff review.

East Del Ray Avenue Park Phase 2 Construction

Construction of Phase 2 improvements were completed the week of July 07. The on-site work included installation of new pathways and a labyrinth area. In the fall, when planting conditions are more favorable, new trees will be planted. The play area remained open throughout the construction. Weather permitting, construction will conclude in two weeks. This project was funded with contributions from the Del Ray Citizens Association in partnership with the City of Alexandria.

Freedmen's Cemetery

The project is progressing towards final completion. The General Contractor is currently remediating work that has been determined non-compliant with the project construction contract documents/specifications. Final completion is anticipated for late July, 2014. Dedication ceremony is scheduled in early September, 2014.

Hooffs Run Park Playground Renovation

Park Planning recently completed the construction documents of the playground [concept plan](#) and [play equipment](#) design. The final design incorporates community feedback received throughout the engagement process, including the June 24, October 3, and October 30, 2013 community meetings. The project was re-solicited for bid by the Purchasing Department because only a single contractor responded to the initial call. The new solicitation yielded improved response and contractor has been identified as susceptible to hire pending contract approval. Construction remains anticipated to start late July, 2014.

Potomac Yard Park – Fountain

The fountain at Potomac Yard is operational. Staff is working with the Contractor and Potomac Yard Development to address operating issues identified during start-up.

Montgomery Park

Construction related to renovation of Montgomery Park is substantially complete. Buchanan Partners, Applicant for the Harris Teeter-Old Town North development (DSUP #2010-0027) located at 800 North Saint Asaph Street completed the work. The development includes 175 rental apartments, a 52,000 square foot Harris Teeter grocery store and two levels of underground parking. The Montgomery Park renovation includes, an upgraded enclosed, dog run, water/drinking fountains, benches, upgraded electrical and water service system, full accessibility, landscape irrigation and plantings. Some new trees have expired due to summer heat stress. These trees will be replaced as warranty items by the Applicant during the Fall, 2014.

Simpson Park

In May, Park Planning staff submitted a grant application for Land and Water Conservation funding to improve the playground and adjacent lawn in Simpson Park. The Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation has notified us that they are going to recommend the project for funding to the National Park Service. Staff is completing necessary paperwork to receive the funding, which would be available July 2015.

The proposed Simpson Park playground and passive lawn project ensure that the park, within a walking radius of 12,000 residents, has a balance of active and passive uses. Currently, the organized program areas outweigh the passive, yet, our most recent needs assessment and 2014 Citywide Parks Improvement Plan clearly show that residents want un-programmed space. These are areas where families can picnic, kids can toss a frisbee, and individuals can quietly read a book on a bench. If awarded, the LWCF would help create these desired uses in perpetuity.



