

**American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA)**  
**City of Alexandria, VA**  
**March 22, 2009**

The City of Alexandria and its partners continue to seek federal grant funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). The City has been awarded **\$15.9 million** in federal grant funds through formula and competitive grant programs for fiscal years 2009-2011. In addition, the State of Virginia has retroactively classified prior state aid to the City in the amount of **\$1.5 million** as ARRA funds. These two combined sources of funds result in a total ARRA benefit to the City of Alexandria to date of **\$17.4 million**.

It is important to remember that the stimulus grant application and award process is ongoing. While the City has been awarded thirteen grants, one application remains pending with the federal government. If this pending grant were approved, the City would be awarded **\$10.0 million**. For those grants that have been awarded, the City has not received lump sums of funding from the federal government. Instead, most of the grant money will be provided on a reimbursement basis through existing federal payment and draw-down processes and methods.

The table below provides an overall report on the status of each ARRA grant the City has applied for that has been awarded or remains pending since the enactment of the stimulus legislation. Additionally, the table shows grant funds managed by liaison or partner groups. These funds appear near the bottom of the table. When all these sources of funds are combined they equate to **\$34.4 million in potential federal funding**.

Where known, the table also shows the fiscal year (FY 2009, FY 2010 or FY 2011) in which the grant money will be available.

Additional ARRA benefits that have been awarded to Alexandria, but which are not included in the \$38.6 million total above, include the following:

- Through the Build America Bond provision of the stimulus legislation the City will take advantage of a 35% interest rate subsidy from the federal government that will allow the City to save **\$13.2 million** over the 20 year life span of \$79.7 million in general obligation bonds sold in June 2009.
- The Alexandria Housing and Redevelopment Authority (ARHA) received **\$2.0 million** in grant funding for capital investment in Low Income Housing Tax Credit projects through the Tax Credit Assistance Program. The grant will provide partial funding for the first phase of the James Bland redevelopment which includes 18 public housing units.
