

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA)

The City of Alexandria and its partners continue to seek federal grant funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). To date, the City has sought **\$46.1 million** in federal grant funds through both formula and competitive grant programs. Of this amount, the City and its partners have been awarded a total of **\$13.8 million** for fiscal years 2009-2011. The remaining \$32.3 million in funding requests remain pending, dependent on final decisions on grant awards by the federal government.

It is important to remember that the stimulus grant application and award process is ongoing. While the City has been awarded several grants, many more applications remain pending with the federal government. For those grants that have been awarded, the City has not received lump sums of funding from the federal government. Instead, most of the grant money will be provided on a reimbursement basis through existing federal payment and draw-down processes and methods.

Furthermore, the City continues to seek additional grants. The table below provides an overall report on the status of each ARRA grant that has been applied for since the enactment of the stimulus legislation. The table shows City grants that have been awarded, are expected, or pending. Additionally, the table shows grant funds managed by liaison or partner groups. Finally, the State of Virginia has retroactively classified some prior state aid to the City as ARRA funds. These funds appear near the bottom of the table. When all these sources of funds are combined they equate to **\$46.1 million in potential federal funding**.

Where known, the table also shows the fiscal year (FY 2009, FY 2010 or FY 2011) in which the grant money will be available.

Additional ARRA benefits that have been awarded to Alexandria, but which are not included in the \$46.1 million total above, include the following:

- Through the Build America Bond provision of the stimulus legislation the City will take advantage of a 35% interest rate subsidy from the federal government that will allow the City to save **\$9.5 million** in interest rate costs over the 20 year life span of \$79.7 million in general obligation bonds sold in June 2009.
- The Alexandria Housing and Redevelopment Authority (ARHA) received **\$2.0 million** in grant funding for capital investment in Low Income Housing Tax Credit projects through the Tax Credit Assistance Program. The grant will provide partial funding for the first phase of the James Bland redevelopment which includes 18 public housing units.
