

BRAC Neighborhood Parking Protection Options for Discussion

Option 1 – Establish Residential Permit Parking Districts under current process

Option 2 – Establish Multiple Residential Permit Parking Districts under modified process

Residents would participate in the existing Residential Permit Parking program.

1. The City continues to work with neighborhoods to establish boundaries for districts.
2. The City approves establishment of permit parking districts.
3. RPP program is activated block-by-block based on petition.

Option 3 – Establish Single Large Residential Permit Parking District under modified process

Residents would participate in the existing Residential Permit Parking program.

1. The City continues to work with neighborhoods to establish the boundary for the district.
2. The City approves establishment of the permit parking district.
3. RPP program is activated block-by-block based on petition.

Option 4 - Daytime Parking District

The City designates the BRAC impact area and restricts parking on the public roadways within those areas (similar to Overnight Parking District program). Restrictions would be:

1. Vehicles parked on roadways during restricted hours must be registered within the City of Alexandria and have valid City of Alexandria stickers.
2. Parking would be restricted between 8am and 5pm Monday through Friday except holidays.
3. Residents would be able to obtain permits to allow on-street parking for visitors, guests, contractors and others, as is done through the Residential Permit Parking program.
