If we are going to become carbon neutral, the city can't just focus on one measure - too much is interrelated. Same with prioritization categories in this survey. Incentives and new economic opportunity can be linked with social justice and health, just for one example. Create business models, where businesses and people need to pay for their emissions. This payment can be in the form of assisting others in the community move towards energy efficiency. For example, let me invest in solar for my neighbor and earn carbon credits for doing this that offset some of my energy usage. Establish what is needed for community based shared resources, such as geothermal that services and is jointly owned by multiple households. Let citizens potentially earn money by investing in street charging stations for EVs, community based bike storage, credits/incentives for biking or walking. Another important action would be to change the way we do development from car centric to people centric. we don't need roads on all sides of parks, we need more pedestrian areas. Road narrowing works with improved transport. Park and ride for old town.. use the garages that aren't being used to accomodate this, and remove cars from that area. Disincentive through traffic by working with neighboring communities to improve other transportation options. Public transport should serve daily activities and not just commuters.
