Providing enough affordable housing (especially near transit) to meet forecast needs. Displaced residents and workers who can't afford to live in the city are typically forced to live in outlying counties with limited transit, significantly increasing their household GHG emissions due to much more driving. While the City is doing some great things for affordable housing, it's still not providing enough. The last two years the City only provided 16% of its low-to-middle income dedicated housing production need (see <http://hit.handhousing.org>). Studies from the SF Bay Area show that households in affordable housing near transit have 2/3 less GHG emissions than the regional household average. Meeting its forecast housing needs by producing and preserving enough dedicated affordable housing to meet its forecast share, would be a win-win for equity and climate in Alexandria.

Increasing the cost associated with permitted reductions in the tree canopy. Most development projects request reductions in the required tree canopy and the City's Landscape Guidelines permit such a reduction through payment of a fee. That fee is too low -- development projects should, if anything, increase the tree canopy of the City in order to reduce the urban heat island effect (improving public health) and increase property values associated with mature trees. The City lags behind our neighbors in canopy coverage and many species of now-mature trees are not adapted to the intense heat of urban areas in our warmer climate. As a result, our canopy is in decline and the City is not planting new trees fast enough to stem the decline. The last Urban Forestry Master Plan was released in 2009, far too long ago to set the necessary tone for climate adaptability we now need.

Equity should be considered when approaching the actions taken for mitigation. While some businesses and residents are capable of providing money in the form of fees or taxes to further mitigation, how those businesses and residents that can't provide money can nevertheless contribute to mitigation should also be made clear. Climate Change is a shared difficulty so everyone should have a clear opportunity and responsibility to mitigate it. For those not contributing money, acts of service, volunteering, or education can count as participating in the mitigation efforts. Simply making clear how everyone can and should contribute across demographics presents the problem of climate change equitably.

**Q5**

Whether people understand actual tradeoffs. According to Alexandria's Waste Recovery study, more carbon is generated by separating yard waste from waste destined for our waste-to-energy facility. (It is also more expensive, so a double loser.) Nevertheless, the City believes it's important to separate compostables from energy production. This strikes me as not understanding the true tradeoff involved. I applauded reduced glass recycling when it became clear that glass recycling was not economically feasible, despite it's strong support in the community. Let's find similar ways of making the right choices when we face real world tradeoffs.

Larger, denser cities are cleaner and more energy efficient than smaller cities, suburbs, and even small towns. Ecologists have found that by concentrating their populations in smaller areas, cities and metros decrease human encroachment on natural habitats. Denser settlement patterns yield energy savings; apartment buildings, for example, are more efficient to heat and cool than detached suburban houses. Urban households emit less carbon dioxide than their suburban and rural counterparts. Please consider as broad an interpretation of mitigation efforts as possible when recommending City policy. For example, ADUs are a housing policy, but they increase density, which has the environmental benefits given above and I believe it should count as a mitigation strategy. I encourage you to look similarly broadly when formulating City policy that has environmental benefits.
