

Figure 5: Duke Street Cross Section - Commercial Connector (See Note 1 & 2)






Figure 3: Duke Street (Looking East)




New2 - Interim Bike Facility on Eisenhower




New3 - Interim and Permanent Pedestrian Crossing at Metrorail Station

New4 - S. Patrick Street Pedestrian Improvements







Widen the underpass of Sanger Avenue at I-395 to allow for a future transitway and non-motorized facilities




Commonwealth Avenue Green Street (P-23)



CMAQ / RSTP FUNDING

- Funding requests are bundled to provide NVTAs maximum flexibility, increasing its ability to fund more projects
- Alexandria typically receives a larger share of CMAQ funding

CMAQ

Funds projects that reduce emissions and improve air quality.

- New Projects that Reduce Emissions
- Operating Costs for Initial 3 Years of New/Expanded Service
- Non-Motorized Capital Projects
- Transportation Demand Management

RSTP

More flexible funds for projects that improve or preserve transportation infrastructure:

- General Non-Motorized Capital Projects
- Research & Studies
- Bike/Ped Improvements, Trails, ADA Upgrades
- Transportation Demand Management
- Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS)
- Shelters and Stations



Safety

- Expansion of automated enforcement

- Safe passing requirements around bicycles
- Requirement to stop for peds at crosswalks

Funding

- Increase in the gas tax
- Fuel efficient vehicles will be subject to a highway use fee or may enroll in a mileage-based user fee program
- Establishment of a new Virginia Passenger Rail Authority
- Creation of transit incentive and several safety funding programs.

2021 Context

- COVID related impacts to budget and how transportation is being used
- Highlight on disparate impacts to different populations
- VA:
 - Short session
 - Need actionable priorities
- Federal:
 - 2020 elections may change outlook




Staff Proposal

- Preserve dedicated funding and new revenue sources for transit
- Fully restore Northern Virginia's regional multimodal funding
- Continue to advance legislation to help us achieve Vision Zero
 - Bicycle safety
 - Decreased DUI threshold
 - Higher fines for harming vulnerable road users
