



NO THRU TRUCKS SIGN REQUEST INFORMATION

The purpose of installing No Thru Trucks signs is to restrict any combination of truck, tractor truck, trailer, or semitrailer on the requested roadway (pickup trucks or panel trucks are exempt). Restricting large trucks maintains the character of the community, decrease frequency for asphalt and pavement maintenance, and ensures large trucks driver are using designated truck routes. City of Alexandria's Traffic Engineering staff will determine if requested site is appropriate through traffic investigation.

Self-Check: Answer the questions below to determine if the requested street or intersection should be considered for additional stop signs:

1. Is the street classification an arterial or collector street? Refer to attached map.
2. Does this street serve as the only access to another street which allows trucks or does not have restrictions?
3. Will a truck restriction on requested roadway divert trucks to another street that is similar or lower street classification than the requested street?

If you answered "yes" to all the above, your street does not meet the requirements for No Thru Trucks sign. The truck restriction signs shouldn't negatively impact neighboring streets and should adhere to the City's street network plan.

Otherwise, proceed to fill out the form on the next page and submit to the City of Alexandria's Traffic Engineering Department. Please refer to the process in which to expect moving forward.

Process:

1. Complete and Submit application to Traffic Engineering Division.
2. Along with application, please have neighbors complete and sign attached Support Form. Fifty percent (50%) of residents or occupants have to be in favor with the proposed restriction.
3. Based on the eligibility, the City will approve or deny the application.
4. If approved, the City will conduct a Truck Restriction Traffic Investigation
5. Once investigation is complete, city staff will inform Project Champion of findings and eligibility.
6. If the truck restrictions are deemed appropriate, city staff will inform the Project Champion, along with any (if any) nearby civic associations.
7. The findings of the investigation will be docketed for a Public Hearing before the Traffic and Parking Board. The Project Champion is expected to attend the Traffic and Parking Board Public Hearing and provide testimony.
8. With the Traffic and Parking Board's approval, city staff will ensure to communicate to motorists and nearby communities of pending traffic pattern change.
9. Once motorists and nearby communities have had adequate notice, No Thru Trucks sign will be installed. City staff will coordinate with City of Alexandria's Police Department for enforcement efforts.

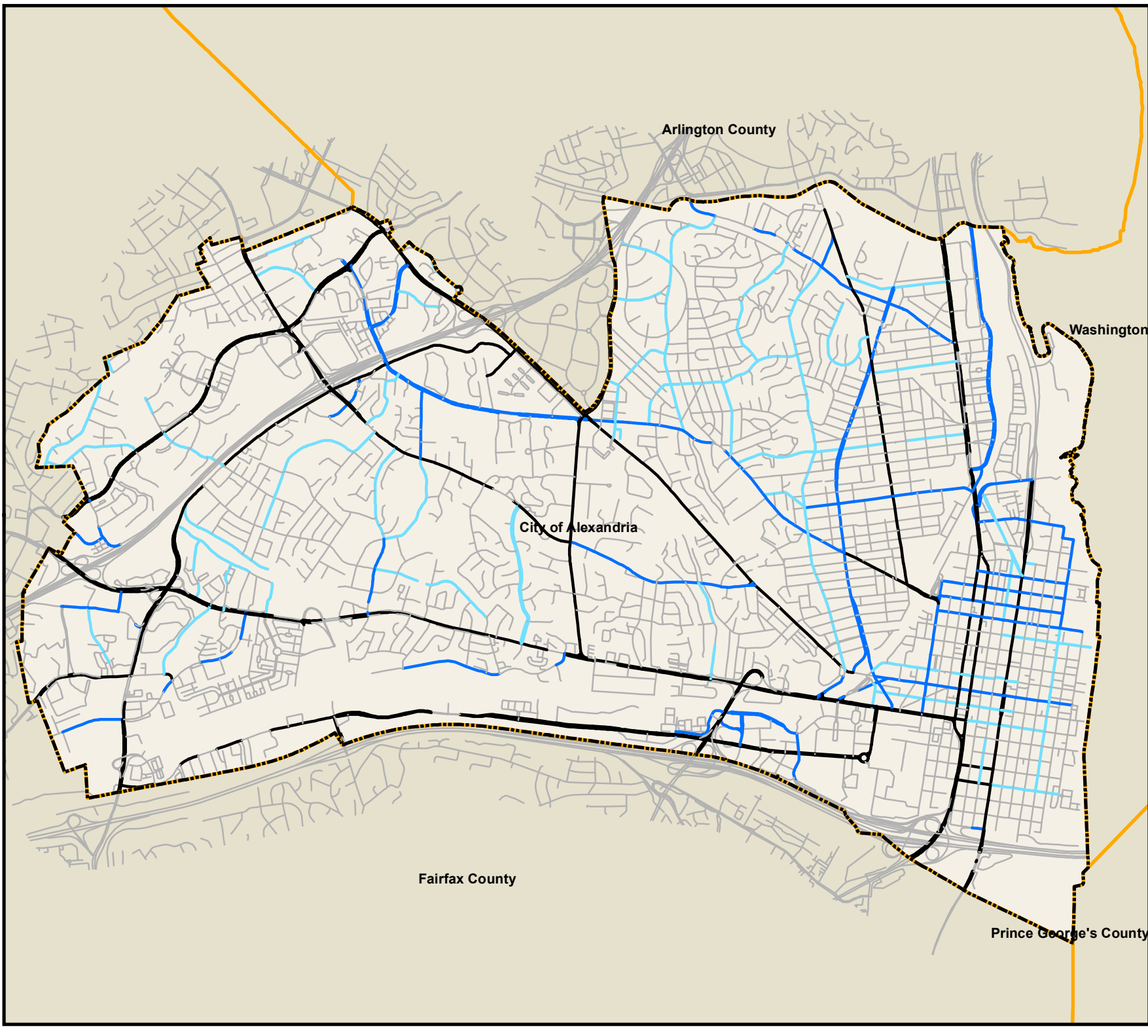
